The Amended Constitution.

A brief review of the more important amendments of the Constitution may aid the people in determining their action.

The first noticeable amendment occurs in the Bill of Rights, in the clause which secures a jury trial to offenders.

The clause in the Bill of Rights, abolishing slavery, is in full conformity to the previous action of the Convention and Legislature.

In Convention, June 12th, 1866, on the clause in the revised Constitution specifying the qualifications of Governor.

MR. PRESIDENT: Under the present Constitution of North Carolina, naturalized citizens are eligible to all State offices.

Some members may be disposed to think that I ought not to enter upon the discussion of this subject, and I was, at first, somewhat inclined to the same view.

I can have no personal interest in the decision of this question, and, practically, it is not of much importance.

Were we even to allow the Constitution to remain unchanged in this particular, a citizen of this class might not be elected Governor of the State for the same space, in the future as such as has fallen to be elected in the past.

I will not, Mr. President, discuss this question in all its bearings. I have no purpose to revive old issues. I am no radical on this, or any other subject.
