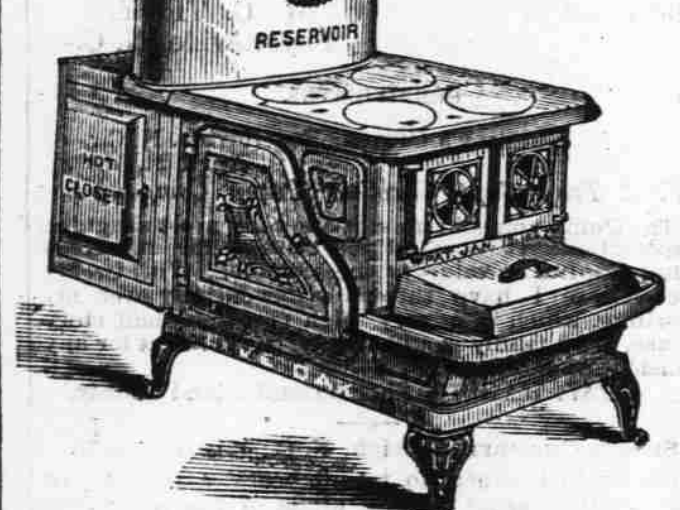
A PROCLAMATION, BY HIS EXCELLENCY, THE GOVERNOR OF NORTH CAROLINA.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, Raleigh, N. C., April 20, 1871. WHEREAS, Information has been received at this Department that the following named persons stand charged by indictment in the County of Buncombe with murder; and WHEREAS, They have escaped, or so concealed themselves that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon them...
