BY HIS EXCELLENCY, THE GOVERNOR OF NORTH CAROLINA. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, Raleigh, N. C., April 20, 1871. WHEREAS, Information has been received at this Department that the following named persons stand charged by indictment in the County of Buncombe with murder; and, WHEREAS, They have escaped, or so concealed themselves that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon them:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOD R. CALDWELL, Governor of North Carolina, by virtue of authority in me vested by law, do issue this my proclamation, ordering the following reward for the arrest of the men named and their delivery to the Sheriff of Buncombe county, viz: For Thomas Brown, Two Hundred Dollars. For George Morehead, Two Hundred Dollars. For Leander S. Hamley, Two Hundred Dollars. And I do enjoin all officers of the law and all good citizens to aid in bringing these criminals to justice.
