It attempts to repeal certain portions of the late law of Congress, IN TERMS; and instructs certain State officers and magistrates to treat that law, as to such portions of it, with utter disregard. This is not the treatment which the dignity or self-respect of Vermont should lead her to bestow upon the legislation of Congress. If the laws of Congress are unwise, or even unconstitutional, it is not for Vermont or any other State to nullify or repeal them. We have placed ourselves by this act in a position in which we have no defence against the judgment of the whole country. We were "thrice armed" when we "had our quarrel just." Why did we throw away our strength ? The influence of Vermont was by no means inconsiderable upon this very subject of slavery. As a constitutional and conservative opponent of that evil institution, she was strong-as a pettish nullifier of the Constitution and the laws, she will become weak and contemptible indeed. In every view the passage of this act is de-The severity of condemnation which this mistep has drawn upon our State, from quarters where a wise man would be proudest of
