THE RECONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE

The Reconstruction Committee is composed of Messrs. Stevens of Pennsylvania (chairman); Boutwell, of Massachusetts; Bingham, of Ohio; Farnsworth, of Illinois; Hulburt, of New York; Beaman, of Michigan; Paine, of Wisconsin; Republicans; Brooks of New York, and Beck, of Kentucky democrats—seven in total.

HOW CONVENTIONS ARE PACKED.

The recent "Republican" Convention which met in Tucker Hall, and put in nomination a long list of candidates for office, was composed of as many members from the several counties, as chose to come to Raleigh, so that some counties had the strength of twenty to fifty, while others had but one, and in many cases no representation. We find in the Standard of this morning a list of the delegates; and by way of showing how the body was constituted, we have summed up the number in each county, as follows:

Total number of delegates, 291. Of these, twelve counties were represented as follows: Wake, 42; Franklin, 25; Craven, 24; Johnston, 10; New Hanover, 7; Beaufort, 7; Davidson, 7; Halifax, 6; Northampton, 6; Alamance, 5; Granville, 8; Cumberland, 8.

It appears, therefore, that of the 291 delegates in the Convention, 155 represented twelve counties, and that 146 delegates represented 63 counties, leaving 14 counties entirely without representation.

Of the 63 counties, eight or ten were represented by non-residents, whose names appear as representatives from other counties. And in one instance, a county is represented by a gentleman recently from Philadelphia. We are not informed whether he has ever been within one hundred and fifty miles of his constituency.

It is singular that any county should be unrepresented, in view of the fact that the Constitutional Convention was in session in which there are but twelve or thirteen "Conservatives" so-called; and so far as we know them by name, all the counties represented by them in that body, were also represented in the Tucker Hall affair. So that some fourteen of the Republican counties were not represented at all, while as many more were represented by generous minded proxies. These facts are sufficient to show that the Tucker Hall Convention was in no proper sense, a representation of the Republican sentiment of North Carolina. It was composed in large degree by volunteers from Wake, and a half a dozen other counties having the greatest facilities for getting to Raleigh.

The 291 delegates whose names are given in the Standard strikes us as another modest statement of the number present. Knowing as we do the capacity of Tucker's Hall, and remembering its crowded condition we cannot doubt that a considerable number of well-wishers to the cause of Mr. Holden, who happened to be in town, were permitted to take part in the proceedings.

In the light of these facts, the imposing "Republican State Convention" of Wednesday last dwindles down to the proportions of a local mass meeting, gotten up in the interest of Mr. Holden. If the Constitutional Convention had not been in session, not a third of the counties would have been represented, while with the aid of that body and its eight dollars per diem, they managed to get up delegations from only 75 of the 89 counties; a dozen or more of them being proxies. The whole affair, therefore, is little better than an imposition.

Mr. Holden was nominated by acclamation; the 42 delegates from Wake, counting equal to as many counties in other parts of the state. This fact may explain another fact, viz: that Wake county, received so many of the best places.

ANOMALOUS ISSUE.

We have two rival parties organized in North Carolina, each of which aims at the monopoly and perpetuation of power, by the disfranchisement of the other. The white man's party aims at the exclusion of all black men from the right of suffrage; while the black man's party aims at the exclusion of a majority of the intelligent whites. It may be hoped that the Constitutional Convention will concede equal rights to all; but this is not the desire of Mr. Holden, nor of Mr. Vance. Neither is the friend of the general welfare, and the rights of all; each is striving to promote the welfare of his own party, at the expense of those who would vote on the other side. We can have no sympathy with such men nor with their ambitious schemes.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE CONVENTION.

MONDAY, March 2nd.

Convention called to order at 10 o'clock. Prayer by Rev. H. T. Hudson, of the M. E. Church.

Journal of Saturday read and approved. A communication from Gen. Canby in regard to contested elections, was announced and referred without reading to the Committee on Privileges and Elections.

PETITIONS, ORDINANCES, &c.

Mr. Andrews, a petition for divorce. Referred. Mr. Blume, a petition of the same nature. Also referred. Mr. Rich of Pitt, offered the following very sensibly preamble and resolution, which should at once be adopted. It would finish up the business of the body, and save something handsome to the Treasury:

WHEREAS, It is of the utmost consequence that this Convention, in view of the importance of this State being represented as a State in the coming Convention at Chicago, should, as speedily as possible finish its work and submit the constitution framed by it to the people for ratification or rejection; now therefore, Resolved, That the President shall appoint a Committee of two from each Congressional District, whose duty it shall be on and after Thursday the 5th day of March, to refer to this Convention all bills, ordinances and constitutional articles which should in the opinion of that Committee, be acted upon by the Convention; and that no other bills, ordinances or constitutional articles shall be acted upon, but those recommended by the Committee appointed in pursuance of this resolution.

Mr. Heaton offered a substitute adjourning the Convention on the 19th inst. Ruled out of order by the chair.

Mr. Harris, of Wake, a resolution providing that the roll be called each morning. Lies over.

By the same, a resolution that no member of the Convention receive pay after the 15th inst. Lies over.

Mr. Rodman, a resolution increasing the Committee on Divorce to five. Lies over.

Mr. Candler, a resolution approving the impeachment of the President, and thanking Congress for so doing. Lies over.

Mr. Jones of Caldwell, a resolution changing the time of meeting of the Convention each morning from 10 to 9 1/2 A. M. Lies over.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

On motion of Mr. Abbott, the report of the Committee on Immigration was then taken up. Mr. Candler offered a substitute empowering the Legislature to create the office, leaving the appointment to the Governor to be confirmed by the Legislature. Made the special order for to-morrow 10 1/2 o'clock.

On motion of Mr. Heaton the rules were suspended and the resolution fixing the time for adjournment *in die* was taken up.

Mr. Rodman moved to amend so that no member receive pay after the 19th inst. Mr. Heaton accepted the amendment.

Mr. Candler offered the following substitute "that it is the sense of this Convention, that we adjourn on the 12th inst, but if the work is incomplete, that the Convention has power to rescind its action in this case." Carried.

SPECIAL ORDER—HOMESTEAD.

The question recurring on the 2nd section as amended.

Mr. Rich moved to strike out in lines one and two, the words "not exceeding one hundred acres of land," which motion prevailed.

Mr. Jones, of Caldwell, moved to amend the ninth line 2nd section, after the word "debt," by inserting, "but no property shall be exempt from taxes, or for payment of obligation contracted for the purchase of said premises." Carried.

Mr. Graham, of Orange, offered a substitute for the whole, leaving the matter with the Legislature, which was lost—yeas, 32; nays, 62.

On motion of Mr. Tourge, further discussion was deferred, and the resolution made the Special Order for Thursday night next.

The report of Committee on Corporations, other than Municipal, was taken up.

Mr. Bryan renewed his motion to reconsider the vote by which section four was stricken out, motion did not prevail.

On motion of Mr. Tourge, his ordinance to prevent the arrestment of Sheriffs, was taken up and passed.

Leave of absence was granted Mr. Ragland.

CALAMITY.

Ordinance repealing an ordinance passed by the Convention of 1865, prohibiting the sale of spirituous liquors at Company Shops. After considerable debate, laid on the table.

Ordinance prohibiting the collection of debts for hire or purchase of slaves, introduced by Mr. Watts.

Mr. Candler moved to amend by inserting "provided that debts contracted for the sale or hire of slaves prior to 1st of January, 1863, shall be collectable."

On motion of Mr. Graham of Orange, laid on the table.

Mr. Rodman moved to suspend the rules and take up his resolution referring the whole matter of divorce to a Committee of five instead of three.

The rules were suspended and after considerable debate, the whole matter was, on motion of Mr. Ing, postponed indefinitely.

Mr. Graham, of Orange, moved to adjourn *in die*. Lost.

The Convention then adjourned until 7 o'clock to-night.

The High Court of Impeachment.

The following is a list of the Senators who are to try Andrew Johnson upon the articles of impeachment presented by the House of Representatives. The politics of each Senator, and the State from which he is, are given. It will be seen that the Senate consists of fifty-three members. A Mystery Explained.

His wife, who seemed much agitated, waked him one night at a village inn, and told him there was a woman sitting at the foot of the bed knitting. The Judge saw the figure as distinctly as his wife, but having no thought of a supernatural origin of vision, began to speculate on its real cause. After looking sharply for some minutes, while the woman knitted on with untrifling composure, he was confident that he could see the wall through her, and she could not therefore be substantial flesh and blood. This discovery, which might have frightened weaker men, only aroused his curiosity. He at once rose from the bed, and walking to the foot, saw that no one was there—the form had vanished.

Putting his head as nearly as possible in the position where he had seen the woman, the mystery, was at once explained. He saw a circular hole in the shutter behind the bed, through which rays of light were streaming, and going to this hole to look through, saw a woman in the room on the other side of the street knitting. The nerves of the wife were greatly soothed by this discovery, and the inquisitive spirit of the Judge was gratified by so simple an explanation of the apparition. Many great stories could be easily shown of their apparently supernatural character by a cool and careful investigation.
