It is perhaps well to observe, that a considerable Part of the Donations by Subscription, has been already lost through Involencies, &c. and that it remains altogether uncertain what Part of the Sum still due can be recovered. The Probability, however, is, that of the Amount due, as above stated, viz. £ 787 12 4, not more than two-thirds will ever be received.

It is also proper to remark, that there is a great Uncertainty of receiving full Payment even for the Judgments which have been obtained, or for the Bonds in the Hands of the different Agents of the Board. Another Circumstance worthy of Consideration is, the Expenses necessarily incurred in Collections, and also the Sums frequently refunded by the Trustees, as well for Deficiencies in Land sold by their Attornies and Commissioners, as for Lands improperly sold; that is, where such Lands had either been sold by the Commissioners of Confiscation under the State, or were claimed by Rights prior to that of the Trustees. Several such Instances have already occurred, and more Claims of the same Kind still remain to be adjusted. On duly weighing these Circumstances, it will be easily seen, that great Allowances must be made in calculating on the Funds of the University. There is much Reason to believe, that the whole Amount, could the proper Deductions be now ascertained, would fall short of Ten Thousand Pounds.

The Lands belonging to the Trustees are as follow, viz.

In the State of North-Carolina, being at and near the University,	Acres, 1,572
In the State of Tennessee, 20,000 Acres of which lie within the Indian Boundary,	29,858

In this Statement of Lands, there is no Notice taken either of the Escheated or Confiscated Property, which yet remains unsold. Respecting these, I have never obtained sufficient Information to ascertain them.

With Regard to the Lands in Tennessee, it is proper to remark, that by the Will of Major Charles Gerard, who bequeathed to the Trustees of the University his Lands in that State, amounting to about 9,858 Acres, the Trustees are not permitted to sell any part whatever within seven Years after his Death; and as to that Part of them granted to him as his own Service-Right, viz. 2560 Acres, they are not allowed to sell it at all, having only the Liberty of renting it annually. Respecting the 20,000 Acres lying within the Indian Boundary, it is obvious that no Sale of them can be now made to advantage. Thus little Hope can be entertained of those Lands yielding any Profits to the University for several Years; especially when it is considered, that with Respect to those given by Major Gerard, the Trustees will have to contend with several adverse Claimants, as is now suggested; and, of course, a considerable length of Time must elapse before their Right can be fully confirmed, should they even be so fortunate as ultimately to establish it.

The present contingent Expenses of the University, including Salaries, and exclusive of the Sums advanced for Buildings, amount to about Nine Hundred Pounds annually. This Sum exceeds, by several Hundred Pounds, the total Amount of annual Interest received on Bonds, Funded Stock, &c. and from such a Diminution of the Principal, it will readily be perceived that the present Funds of the University cannot long support that Institution. It may perhaps be proper likewise to observe, that the Trustees have commenced the principal or main Building of the University, and have carried the Walls of it to the Windows of the second Story. This Undertaking, however, for the Want of Funds necessary to complete it, they are now compelled, for the present, to abandon.
