House of Representatives. Friday, Feb. 18. The Speaker laid before the House a report from the Secretary of the Treasury...

A bill to revive and continue in force an act to establish trading houses with the Indian tribes, was read a third time and passed.

Mr. Randolph, from a committee, reported a bill to modify the propositions in the act admitting the people of the North-western Territory as a State into the Union...

Mr. Nicholson, from the committee on the President's message, enclosing sundry documents reflecting John Pickering, district judge for North Hampshire...

Mr. Bayard reported a bill for the relief of Joshua Harvey and others.

Saturday, February 19. A bill was reported appropriating 2,000 dollars for working the salt-springs on the Wabash rivers.

Mr. Nicholson reported a bill for regulating the grants of land, and providing for the disposal of lands south of Tennessee...

Mr. N. stated that the claimants of the lands of the U. States lying south of Tennessee, had applied to the committee to be heard before them by counsel...

Monday, Feb. 27. The bill making an appropriation for the navy for 1803 (the sum appropriated is 1,098,797 dollars)...

Mr. Goddard spoke against the bill, and concluding by moving the postponement of the further consideration of the bill to the 1st Monday in November.

This motion was supported by Messrs. Davis and Goddard, and opposed by Mr. Smille. The question was put on the passage of the bill, it was lost, 42 to 38.

Mr. R. Williams called up his motion making it a standing rule of the house, that all questions respecting priority of business should be decided without debate.

The general appropriation-bill was completed, and ordered for a third reading. The house took into consideration the bill extending the time for the location of military land warrants...
