AN ACT

Making appropriations for the fupport of government for the year one thousand eight hundred and three.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress affembled, That for the expenditure of the civil lift in the prefent year. including the contingent ex. pences of the feveral departments and officers; for the compensation of the feveral loan officers and their clerks, and for books, and ftationary for the fame; for the payment of annuities and grants; for the fupport of the mint eftablinment: for the expences of inter. courfe with foreign nations ; for the fupport of light houfes, heacons, bunys, and public piers ; and for fa. tisfving certain mifcellaneous claims, the following fums he, and hereby are appropriated, that is to fay :.

lars. For compensation of clerks employed for the purpole of making drafts of the feveral furveys of land in the territory of the United States.
