By the President of the United States. WHEREAS, the President of the United States is authorized by law to cause lands to be offered for sale:

Therefore, I, James Monroe, President of the United States, do hereby declare and make known that the public sales shall be held as follows, viz:

At the Land Office at Terre Haute, in Indiana, on the first Monday in July next, for the sale of Townships 17 & 18, in range 1, east of the 2d principal meridian line.

At the same place, on the 3d Monday in August next, for the sale of Townships 11, 12, 13 & 14, in ranges 1 & 2, E of the 3d principal meridian line.

At the Land Office at Vandalia, in Illinois, on the 3d Monday in July next, for the sale of Townships 11, 12, 13 & 14, in ranges 3 and 4, do

At the same place, on the 1st Monday in August next, for the sale of Townships 10, 11, 12 & 13, in ranges 9, 10 & 11, east of 3d prin'l mer'd'n line.

At the same place, on the 1st Monday in November next, for the sale of Townships 13 19 20 & 21, in ranges 9 10 & 11 E of 3d prin'l mer'd'n line.

At the Land Office for the Northern district of Louisiana, at the town of Onachita, on the 1st Monday in November next for the sale of Townships 15 16 17 18 and 19, in ranges 1 2 3 4 and 5, west of the mer'd'n line.

At the Land Office at the Seat of Justice of the county of Independence, in the Arkansas territory, for the sale of such lands of the United States as are situated in the following described townships and ranges, and which have been excluded from the lottery of the lands appropriated for satisfying warrants for military services, viz:

On the 1st Monday in August next, for the sale of such of the above described lands as are situated in the following townships and ranges, viz:

IN NORTH-CAROLINA.

- 122 From Warrenton by Falkener's and Louisville to Raleigh, every day, 57 miles. A mail is to be carried to Putney's and Dancy's Store every Wednesday. Leave Warrenton every day at 9 h 30 m p m and arrive at Raleigh next day by 11 h 48 m a m.

- 123 From Raleigh, by Banks and Averyboro to Fayetteville, every day, 60 miles. Leave Raleigh every day at noon and arrive at Fayetteville next day by 3 h 14 m a m. Leave Fayetteville every day at 3 h 37 m p m and arrive at Raleigh the next day by 7 h 44 m a m.

- 124 From Fayetteville, Council's Lumber, Leesville, Rowland's, Newman's bridge and Marion ch to Godfrey's Ferry, S. C. every day, 88 miles. Leave Fayetteville every day at 5 a m and arrive at Godfrey's ferry next day by 3 h 14 m a m.

- 125 From Suffolk, Va. by Sunbury to Edenton, 52 miles, once a week. Leave Suffolk every Sunday at 7 a m and arrive at Edenton on Monday by 10 a m.

NOTES. 1. The Post Master General may expedite the Mails, and alter the times for arrival and departure, at any time during the continuance of the contract, he paying an adequate compensation for any extra expense that may be occasioned thereby.
