THE Public Treasurer, reflecting with state pride and self complacency, on the punctual and praise-worthy manner in which the Sheriffs and the other Revenue Officers of North-Carolina have, for many years past, acquitted themselves of the trusts and duties enjoined on them by law, with respect to the collecting and accounting for the public dues; holds it unnecessary here to call on them or any of them, in regard to the Taxes of the current year; and will therefore consider that enough is said when they are reminded, that the time fixed by law for settling their Accounts and making Payment at the Treasury, is now at hand; and that it, of course, remains for those concerned to continue so to conduct themselves, as effectually to support and sustain that reputation and high standing which have been hitherto so generally and deservedly accorded to them, as Revenue Officers aforesaid.

A PROCLAMATION.
WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of the State of North-Carolina, the Governor of the State is authorized to cause the unsold Lands lately acquired by Treaty from the Cherokee Tribe of Indians, to be offered for sale.
Now therefore, I, GABRIEL HOLMES, Governor of the State of North-Carolina, do hereby declare and make known that a Public Sale for the disposal, agreeably to law, of the said lands shall be commenced at Waynesville, in the County of Haywood, on Monday the 28th of October next, under the superintendance of a commissioner appointed for that purpose, who is authorised by my letter of instructions to adjourn the said sale to or near the site which shall previously be laid off for a Town on the said lands, should such adjournment be deemed advisable. One eighth part of the purchase money will be required of the purchaser at the time of the sale, and bond and security for the payment of the balance, in the following instalments, viz: one-eighth at the expiration of one year, one-fourth at the end of two years, one-fourth at the end of three years, and the remainder at the end of four years. The sale to continue for two weeks and no longer.
