What the Organization is Doing Throughout the Country. An Alliance store has been opened at Shenandoah, Va.

The National Farmers' League has only been started six months and has a membership of 40,000 in the State of New York alone.

The Georgia County and Sub-Alliances are all standing firmly against the use of jute bagging. Cotton bagging will be one substitute.

The Americas, Ga., Recorder states that an Alliance warehouse is to be opened at Pinehurst, in Dooly county. This, we think, gives Dooly several Alliance warehouses at convenient points, says the Atlanta Journal.

The Times Journal, of Eastman, Ga., says: At a meeting of the Alliance here on Tuesday last, they decided that they would again use cotton bagging and made arrangements to have a large lot of it ordered at once.

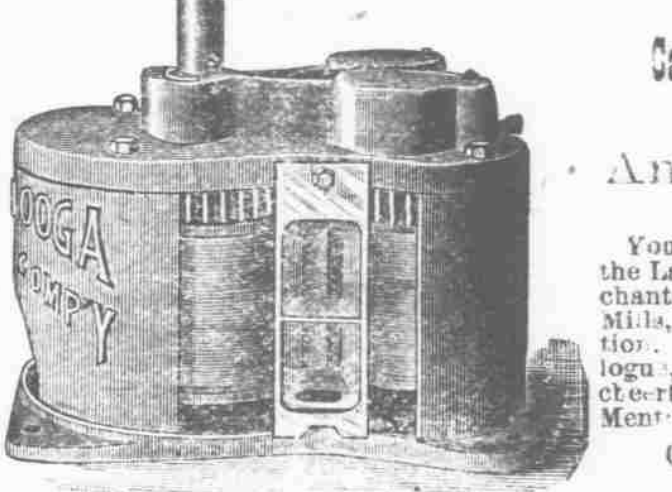
