Washing wool - We make no charge for washing wool, except rolls, for which we charge one cent per lb. We will pay freight on all wool sent by railroad exceeding ten pounds...

Labels - We will allow in exchange for goods 50 cents for clean washed wool free labels. Labels for wool in dirt free from any stain. For carry wool we will make labels so that we think to be fair and reasonable.
