The Grand Champion of the Show and Sale will be sold to **President Wilson**, for, and in consideration of one \$1 bill which will be especially engraved and signed by the President. The Bull will immediately be resold as the property of the President, the proceeds going to the Birmingham Chapter American Red Cross.

Already bull clubs are being organized in every community. Why not start one in your community and get one of these good bulls. Mrs. Robt. Jemison, Sr., Birmingham, Ala., holds the honor and distinction of being the first woman to organize the first Shorthorn Bull Club in America.

N. K. Newman, chairman of the Gulf States Division located at New Orleans, has donated a Holstein bull, absolutely one of the best of the breed, having paid \$1,000 for him. This bull will be offered after the Shorthorns.
