## SOMETHING TO MAKE

## A Footsteol

$\mathrm{A}_{\text {stool is mighty }}^{\text {FTER day's hard work, a foot- }}$ A stool is mighty restful to father
or mother; or sueh a stool will make or mother; or such a stool will make
a handy seat for some young person. The stool shown herewith is made of inch boards, havirg a top 10 inches of inch boards, haviarg a top 10 inches
wide and $121 / 2$ inehes long, while the 10 -inch-high legs are sawed from a board 9 inches wide, in the shape in-

dicated. The legs are tied together by a crosspiece 2 inches wide and $12 \frac{1}{2}$ inches long, which is held in place by wedges. Shoutders should be cut on each end of the crosspiece so that when the wedge at each end is tightened the crosspiece will be held firm. In cutting the slots in the legs for the crosspiece and in the crosspiece for the wedges, care should be taken to do a neat job. These may be cut with a seroll or keyhole saw or may be roughly cut out with brace and bit and then dressed with a chisel.
