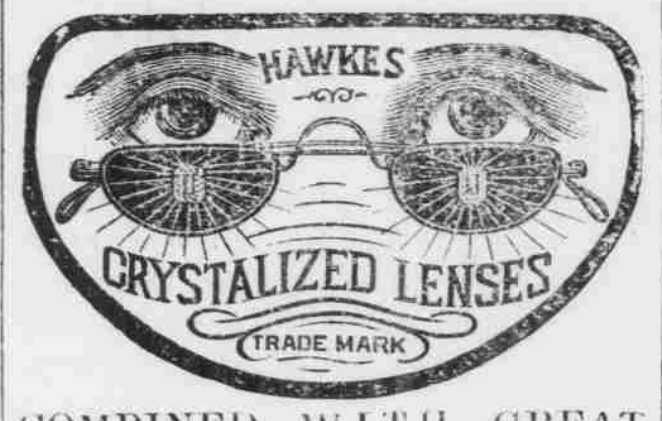

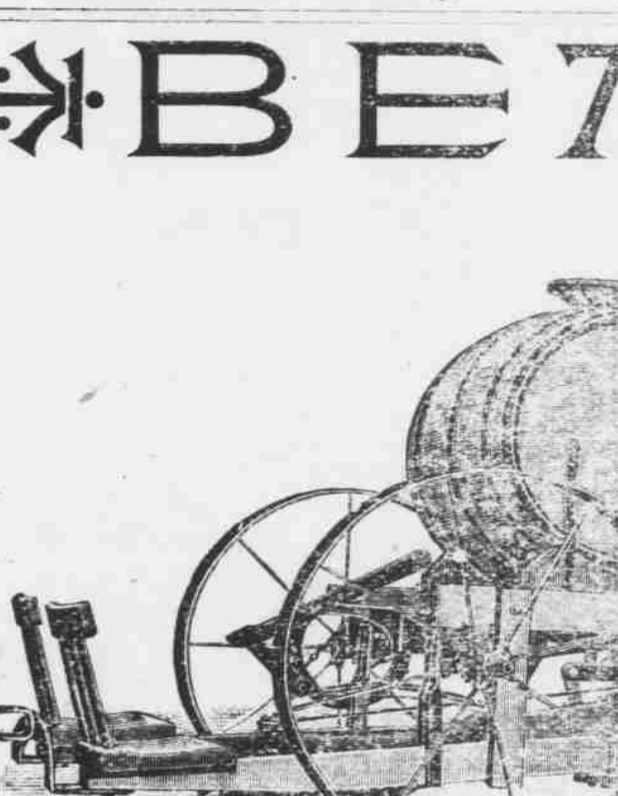

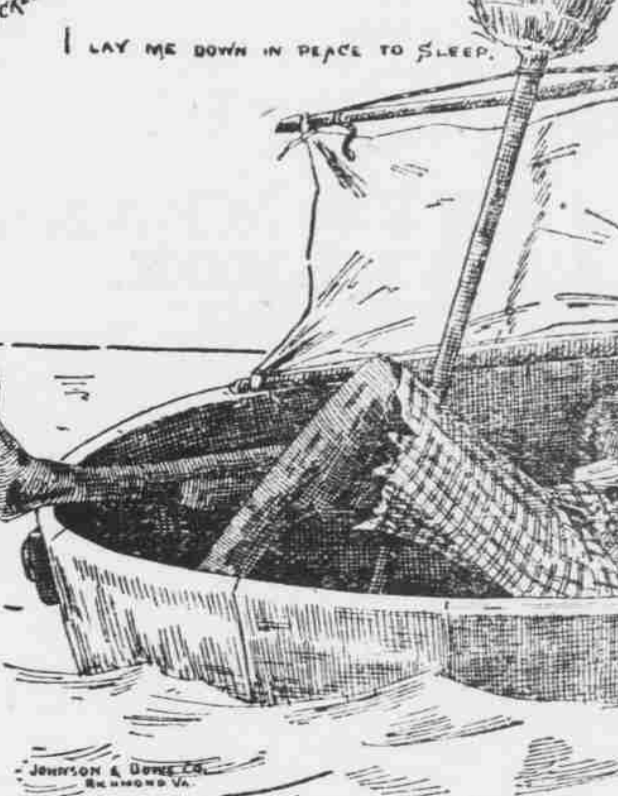


BEEMIS TOBACCO TRANSPLANTER.
