FARMERS' ALLIANCE.

"IN UNITY THERE IS STRENGTH."

Resolutions Adopted by the Granville County Alliance at the October Meeting, 1891.

That whereas, Mr. J. T. Britt, editor of the PUBLIC LEDGER has offered space in his paper to the Farmers' Alliance of this county free, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we accept said proposition and appoint Brother A. S. Peace to control the same.

"It is Against the Constitution."

When younger than now it so chanced that we were a candidate on the Democratic ticket for the Legislature. There lived a simple minded colored man in our neighborhood who was a Republican without knowing why.

On the day of election we met him on his way to the polls and asked him for his vote—"just my name in place of the other man's on your ticket," we pleaded. "You know I am and have always been your friend. You have lived in the family ever since freedom and you have never asked a favor that you have not received." "I know you are my friend; yes sah," came the reply with a knowing look that would have discomfited King Solomon. "Well then, just let me scratch out this name and insert mine in place of it." "No sah, boss, no sah," came the response with a jerk of the head and a blink of the eyes equal to that of a frog eating fire. "Why not?" we enquired. "Because it is against the constitution to scratch a ticket."

We knew it was an unconscious color prejudice that prevented him reciprocating favors; and inasmuch as he had lived so long with us as to entitle him in African parlance to become one of the family, we felt proud that he had some excuse to give which seemed to relieve him from feelings of ingratitude. But now there is no color in it; we are all of the same flesh and blood—brothers in the same household of political faith. Nor are we any candidate; only one of many humble citizens begging our leaders who are intelligent, refined and well-informed about most things, but woefully ignorant as to the real condition of the people, to give us some relief from the burdens of unjust laws—laws enacted for the benefit of the few to the detriment of the many. We only ask "equal rights for all and special privileges for none." We are answered by our sages that they know our cause of discomfort; that it is from the lack of money in circulation and by reducing the tariff about seven cents on the dollar's worth of imports, with free coinage of silver and the repeal of the tax on State banks, all will be well. We reply the first you are unable to do, the second you are unwilling to do, and the third you never intend to do. Therefore, we demand government ownership of railroads; that foreigners shall not be allowed to own our lands; and that we have a sufficient amount of money distributed by the government direct to the people on the sub-treasury plan.

To the first demand, the railroad king answers, it is against the Constitution to interfere with my domains. To the second demand the alien land grabber replies, it is against the constitution to interfere with my rights as a European investor. To the third demand the plutocrat says, it is against the Constitution to lend money to the farmers; that would break me up in my work of making millionaires by the thousand per annum and paupers by the hundred thousand. Then the words of all these combined together, with all those who like the Jews think "nothing good can come out of Nazareth," like puppets take up the refrain with an air of wisdom born of ignorance with one voice cry "Unconstitutional."

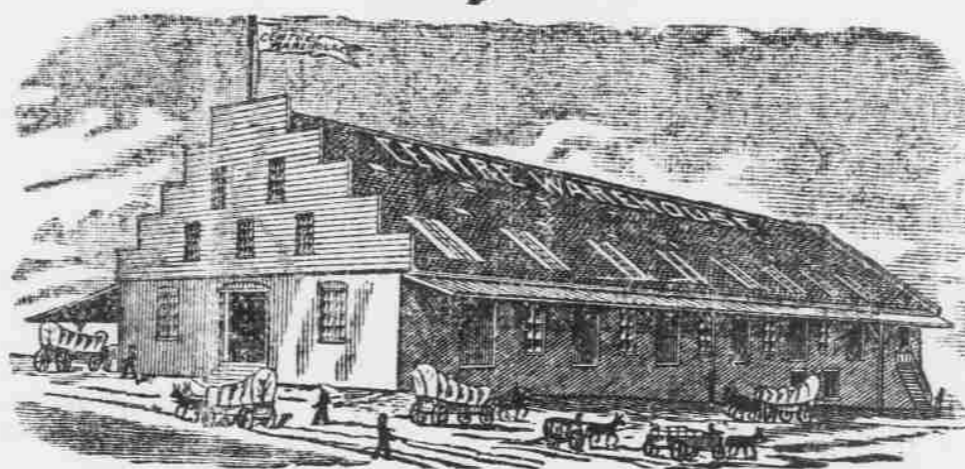

NEW MARKET REGULATIONS!

All Farmers Allowed to sell Their Own Products in any Quantity on the Streets of Oxford.

The following are the new market regulations adopted by the Town Commissioners at their last meeting:

SEC. 64. No fresh meat or fish shall be sold or offered for sale on any of the sidewalks or streets of the town, under a penalty of five dollars for every violation of this ordinance. Provided, that this shall not prevent any resident of the country from selling and offering for sale on the streets, from wagons, fresh meat, fruits or vegetables, the product of his farm.

SEC. 65. No live poultry shall be kept on the sidewalks or streets of the town, unless the coops or boxes in which the same are kept shall be well cared for and approved by the Chief of Police and all persons refusing to remove or clean the same after notice from Chief of Police shall be fined five dollars; nor shall fresh meat or fish be retained in any store in the town unless carefully kept in ice boxes are provided for the same, and in no case will meats or fish be permitted to be hung in front of stores or displayed on the streets or sidewalks under penalty of five dollars.

SEC. 66 of the regulations is stricken out.

SEC. 67. That all peddling or hawking fresh meats, fish or oysters through the town is forbidden and all violators of this ordinance shall pay a fine of five dollars.
