A General Epitome of Recent Occurrences Around and About Us, From the Mountains to the Sea, as Culled from our State Papers.

Durham is to have electric street cars.

Miss Addie Williams, local reporter on the excellent Charlotte Observer, has taken a vacation. She has gone to Denver, Col.

W. A. B. Branch was renominated for Congress by the Democratic convention of the First Congressional District by acclamation.

At the Democratic convention of the Sixth Congressional district convention held Wednesday Congressman Alexander was renominated by acclamation.

Near Henderson Tuesday a negro named Elijah Williams got into a dispute with another negro named Snow, and struck him with a piece of railroad iron.

In a family row near Fayetteville Monday night Hugh Jackson shot and killed Sam McFadyen, his father-in-law. The trouble grew out of McFadyen's threats and efforts to kill Jackson's mother.

The State Pharmaceutical Association elected the following officers: President, H. R. Cheers, of Plymouth; Vice-Presidents—N. D. Fletcher, of Concord; J. H. Bobbitt, of Raleigh; W. G. The North Carolina Railway Commission has completed its statement of its assessment of value of railway property in the State as follows: Value of trade, \$17,497,130; rolling stock, \$1,773,150; depots and warehouses, \$648,040; value of Pullman cars in proportion to their mileage in North Carolina, \$80,289.

J. D. Boushall, Chief Clerk to the State Auditor, has tendered his resignation to take effect on September 1st. Mr Boushall leaves the Auditor's office to enter into the practice of the law in Raleigh.
