

"How much would such a survey cost ?" queried the reporter.

"Well," said Mr. Edison, "one competent geological surveyor and four or five assistants would be sufficient. It would take that force about five years to complete the State survey in a satisfactory manner. I should think \$6,000 a year would cover all the expenses."
