

The new sewerage system of the city of Worcester, Mass., is said to have been demonstrated to be an unqualified success. The sewerage is collected in large tanks, and when the work of chemical precipitation has is discharged into the Blackstone River, is so pure that chemists say it might be drunk with safety.
