UNDER FALSE COLORS.

The New York Sun sails under false colors. It is not Democratic. It is for high protection, a champion of the monopolists and an admirer of the bad Republican leaders. It proceeds from the tea-custard and syllabub dilettanteism, the frivolous and desultory sentimentalism of epicures."

Holding such views Senator Ingalls is worthy of a place on the editorial staff of the Sun, but he has no business in the upper House of Congress.

Rev. Junius T. Harris. Raleigh State Chronicle.

Mr. Harris was a native of Davidson county, the son of a Methodist preacher, and was forty-six years of age. He was left an orphan at an early age and, dependent upon his own exertions, he became a shoemaker and made shoes at Thomasville for the Confederate soldiers until he was 16 years old. Then he enlisted in the army, surrendering with Johnson's army at Bentonville in 1865. He had pluck and ambition and was determined to get an education. His career ought to be an inspiration to every young man.

Returning from the war he took a shoemaker's bench and tools, and went to Trinity College. For five years at this seat of learning he struggled to obtain an education, paying his way by mending the boots and shoes for his fellow-pupils. With all this, he could not pay all his expenses, but he had to go in debt. After leaving, he paid every cent of his indebtedness. At college he was a room-mate of Rev. Frank L. Reid, D. D., who furnishes us this incident showing the "stuff" of which Mr. Harris was made. He graduated with high honors, and within ten days after became pastor of C ry (Methodist) circuit, and has since served Magnolia circuit, Hillsboro station, Lincolnton circuit, Mooresville circuit, Statesville station, and St. Paul's station in Goldsboro. He then served three years as Presiding Elder of Goldsboro District and at his death was closing out his second year as Presiding Elder of Durham District. In September last he was elected to succeed Dr. Dixon as superintendent of the Oxford Orphan Asylum.

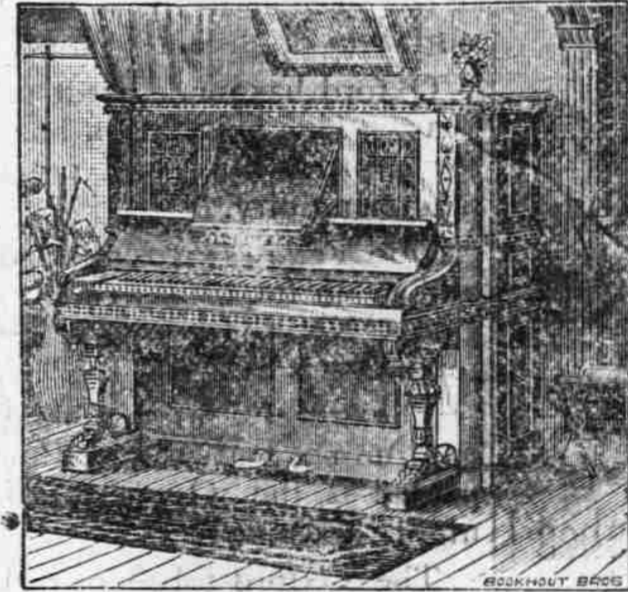

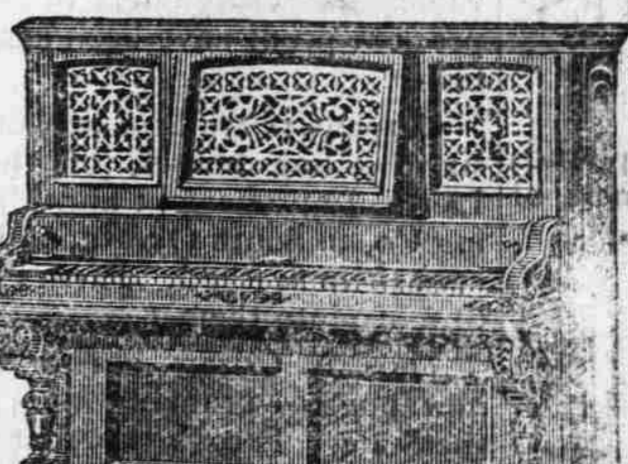
