School Statement

Wholesome growth is usually so gradual that to the casual observer it is imperceptible. It is like the river described by Caesar in his Commentaries, which flows so slowly and smoothly that it was difficult to tell in which direction it was moving. The only way to get a clear conception of the movement is to take a section extending over a longer period of time than can be seen by actual observation, and compare the extremes of this period. The decade is a favorite measure with us in comparisons of this kind, so I will give the school statistics of to-day contrasted with the year 1902-3-1912-13:

In the above statistics for 1902-3 the schools of Oxford are included. This would make the increase considerably greater if included in last year's account. The special tax alone last year was over \$800, more than half as much as the total fund ten years ago.
