Ready for Emergency

Not only are these great concerns ready to throw their factories open to the government, but Mr. Johnson stated that the Baldwin Locomotive Works is ready, if necessity should arise, to abandon the manufacture of any other product than war munitions in order to assure the government an unlimited source of supplies should the expedition into Mexico prove a harder task than it is believed it will, or if any emergency should arise.
