GENERAL NEWS

The government last week set in motion the machinery to apprehend and punish pro-German workers who have started an organized campaign in more than a dozen states to defeat the Liberty Loan.

Declining to contravert over "miscellaneous details" the Farmer's Union executive committee in Raleigh last week resolved unanimously that the state union should in November adopt ringing resolutions of loyalty to the national government.

The government forecast of the first war crop of potatoes is 452,000,000, an increase of 100,000,000 bushels over last year, according to an announcement by L. D. Sweet, head of the potato division of the United States food administration.

Sheriff's posses from several Tennessee counties last week searching for two armed men who held up an express messenger aboard a Chicago, Memphis & Gulf railroad train near Dyersburg, Tenn., and escaped with about \$12,000 in currency. At a late hour no trace of the men had been found.

Apparently, contingents of the Russian fleet—in all about 20 warships of various classes are bottled up in Moon sound, with a cordon of German warcraft barring their progress northward back into the Gulf of Finland or to the south into the Gulf of Riga.

Brigadier General Littell, in charge of army cantonment construction has issued a statement describing the status of heating plant construction in the national army camps. He said the last of the plants probably would be completed by November 1, and that in all camps temporary use of stoves had been authorized.

Representatives of 200,000 organized railroad workers in the northeastern part of the United States and east Canada decided at Ottawa, Ont., to recommend to their unions that they demand from their employers wage increases of not less than 20 per cent. The workers involved are trainmen, conductors, baggage men, brakemen and yardmen.

Dr. Frederick A. Cook, the Arctic explorer and a crew of 19 sailors were among those marked for assassination by the leaders directing the alleged plot to foment a revolution in India to embarrass Great Britain during the war, according to testimony given by Sukumar Chatterji, a Hindu Priest, in Judge Landis' Court, at Chicago, of the trial of Gustav H. Jacobsen, wealthy Chicago real estate dealers, and his three co-defendants charged with the conspiracy.

Psychological examinations of national army men have two purposes, one military and one medical, it was explained by W. V. Bingham of the Carnegie Institute of Technology, Pittsburg, one of the seven psychologists who worked out the method now being applied at four of the cantonments. The military purpose he said, is to furnish commanding officers with a rating for each man in his command by which he may be guided in selecting men for promotion or for special duties requiring more than average intelligence.

Food Administrator Hoover gave notice to the public Saturday that "the corner has been turned" in high food prices and that most of the essential commodities should continue to show reductions between now and the end of the year. At the same time he pointed out that retail prices are not going down in accord with wholesale reductions, and intimated that the consumer himself might correct this by bringing the proper pressure to bear.

Eighty per cent more frozen beef was in stock on October 1 than a year ago. Reports from 293 storages to the bureau of markets, made public showed holdings of 137,806,561 pounds. Stocks of cured beef amounted to 32,644,559 pounds on the same date, an increase of 46.4 per cent, while a decrease of 3.6 per cent in the amount of lamb and mutton in storage was shown, the stock totaling 3,221,234 pounds. Small decreases also were reported from dry salt and pickled pork and lard, but frozen pork increased 12 per cent.

Six hundred and seventy-eight negroes who have been in training for four months at Fort Des Moines officers' training camp were given their commissions in the national army last week. One hundred and sixty were commissioned captains, 320 first lieutenants and 198 second lieutenants. These new officers will command the seventeenth division of the national army, which is composed entirely of negroes. Among the men graduated today are non-commissioned officer of the various negro regiments of the regular army many of them veterans of the Spanish-American war.

STENOGRAPHERS WANTED

Uncle Sam Needs Ten Thousand at Once.

Washington, October 18.—Now that Uncle Sam has the young men of the country in training for military service, he finds that he needs 10,000 typewriter operators and stenographers and typewriters, both men and women, for the Department at Washington. The Civil Service Commission has notified all of its 3,000 boards of examiners that

they should put forth their best efforts to secure these urgently needed workers. White examinations are now held weekly in 450 cities, the Commission states that arrangements will be made to have an examination held at any accessible place where a small class of applicants can be secured. The entrance salaries range from \$1,000 to \$1,200 a year. Promotion is reasonably rapid to those whose services prove satisfactory. No appointment can be made to these or other positions in the Federal classified civil service unless authorized by the Civil Service Commission under the civil service law. Any information to the contrary is unauthorized. This is a splendid opportunity to serve your country. Full information can be secured from the secretary of the board of civil service examiners at the post office in your city.
