Turn into 2 greased coffee cans, filling each about one-half full. Steam three hours after which run into ovens for fifteen minutes to dry out.

Soy Bean Meal Loaf.

1 cup soy bean meal. 1 cup corn meal. 11/2 cup graham flour. 34 cup molasses.

21/2 cups buttermilk.

34 cup raisins. 34 cup nuts.

2 teaspoons salt.

2 teaspoons soda.

Mix bean meal, corn meal, graham flour, salt, nuts and raisins in a bowl, stir soda into molasses, add buttermilk and beat into dry ingredients, turn into greased pan, and bake in slow oven one hour.




