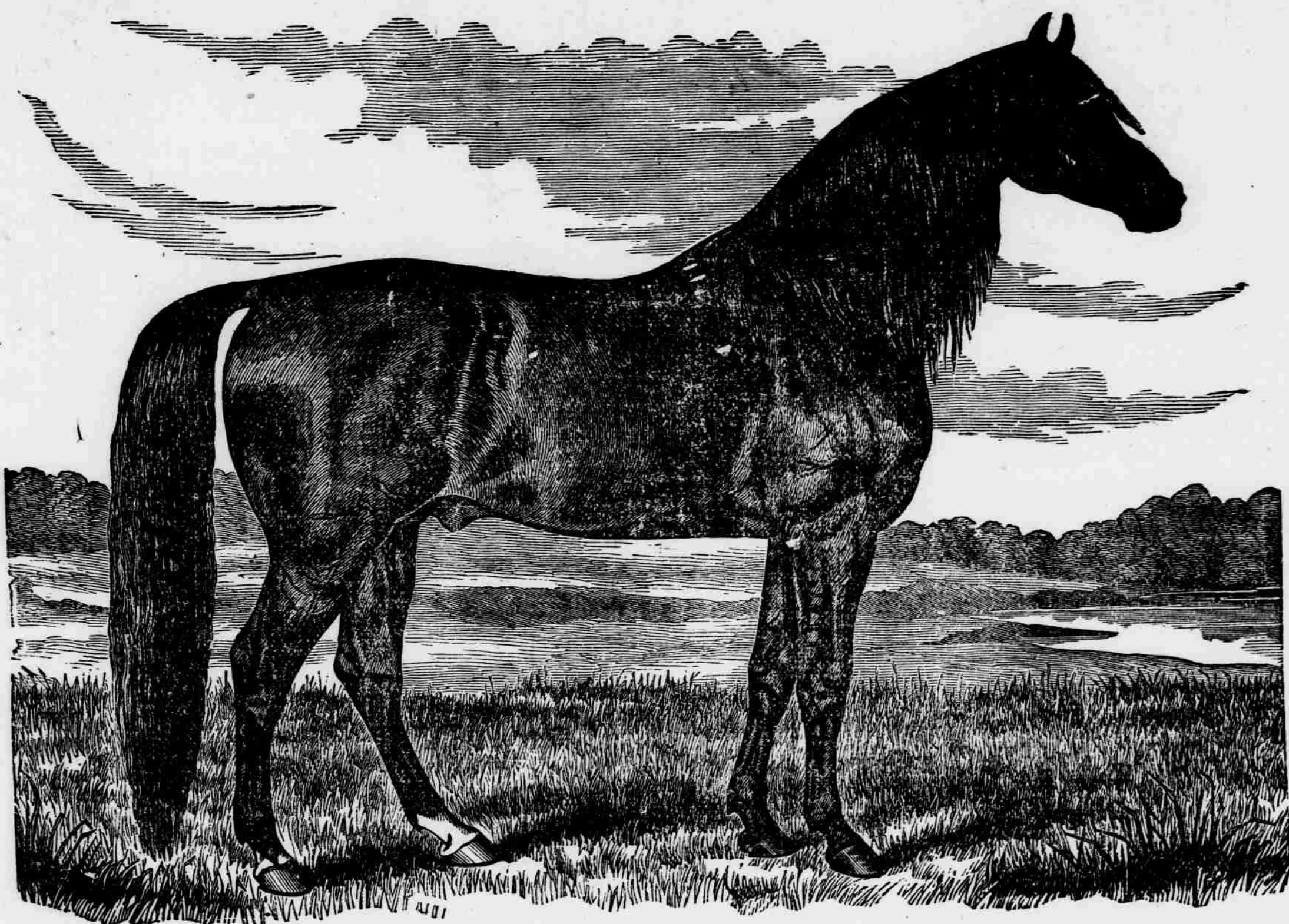

### SAYS COLD WEATHER BRINGS RETURN OF INFLUENZA

Public Must Be Careful to Avoid A Second Epidemic. Easier To Prevent Than Cure. What To Do.

—Robert Ray, known as "the fox of the Potomac," said to have been the last of General Grant's scouts and said to have shot and wounded Belle Boyd, the noted Confederate woman spy, of Richmond, Va., died last week at Oxford, N. Y. He was 87 years old.

—The National Department of Agriculture reports that farm horses are cheaper than they have been for ten years. Prices paid this year average \$127.98. In 1910 the high-water mark was reached at \$145.22, and prices have fluctuated between the two figures since then.

—American builders may accept contracts for steel or wood ships to be built for private American interests without making application to the shipping board for a permit. Similarly wood ships also may be built for foreign account. This was announced by Bainbridge Colby for the shipping board.

Caught Up With the Claims. Another day we never expected to see but it was the one when the prohibition movement would begin to overtake all the exaggerations of prohibition orators.

—An express train from Orleans, France last week crashed into and telescoped another train loaded with American material near Meung-sur-Loire, 11 miles southwest of Orleans. Twelve bodies have been removed from the wreck and identified. Other dead still remain in the debris. Twenty-five persons were injured. Four of the railroad cars were smashed to bits.
