STRENGTH OF MEN.
 That physical strength increases up to a certain age and then decreases goes without saying. But a wide diversity of views is apt to exist concerning when this point of decline supervenes. And as a muscular capacity is not at all an uncommon happening. Tests of several thousand cases made by suitable strength measuring appliances furnish some interesting figures on the subject. In the white race the "lifting" power of the average healthy youth of seventeen is said to be two hundred and eight pounds. It gradually increases and in the thirty-first year it reaches its highest limit, three hundred and fifty-six pounds. Then practically remaining stationary till forty is reached it slowly lessens from that point, fifty showing a diminution of twenty-six pounds from the age of thirty. After fifty the statistics, while all showing diminishing power, are of little value in that the rate of decline varies very much with the individual.

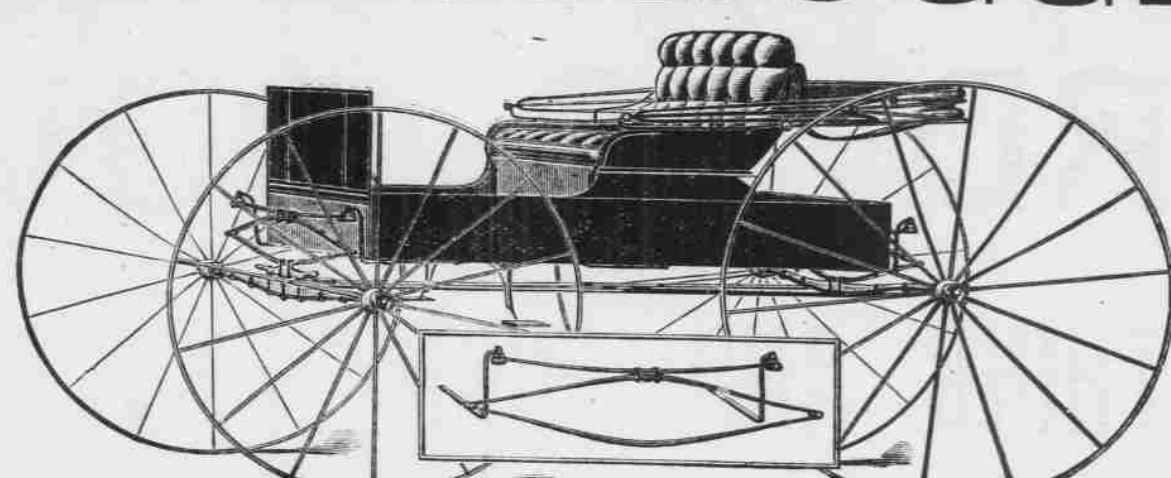

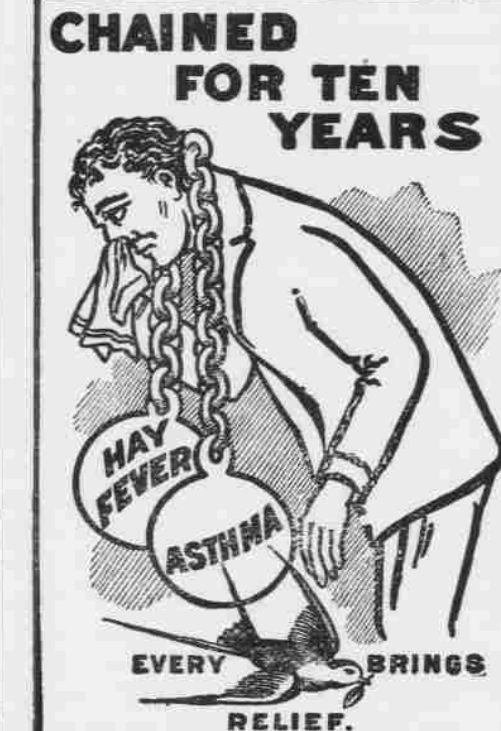
