



The South Carolina Legislature has abolished the State dispensary system of handling liquor, the creature and pet of Senator Tillman, which has been in existence 14 years. The people of the various counties will decide the matter of dispensary or local option by vote. The Governor has also removed from office J. M. Rawlins, John Black and Joseph B. Wiley, directors of the State dispensary, who are charged with misconduct, neglect of duty and incompetency, the specific charges being that these officials disregarded the law, did not buy on sealed bids and approved large purchases in Cincinnati and Peoria at prices in excess of the regular bids.
