THE BOND ISSUE ACT

Legislature.

An act to authorize the board of commissioners of Granville county to issue bonds in the sum of one hundred of said county.

The General Assembly of North Caro-

lina do enact: Section 1. That for the purpose of building, grading, macadamizing and otherwise improving the public roads of Granville county, the board of commissioners of said county is hereby aunot exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, in denominations not exceeding one thousand dollars bearing interest from date thereof at not exceeding the rate of five per centum per annum, with interest coupons attached, payable semi-annually, at such times and places as may be directed by said board of county commissioners; such bonds to be of such form and tenor, and transferable in such way, and the principal thereof payable at such time or times not exceeding thirty years from the date thereof, and at such place or places as the said board of county commissioners may determine; provided, that said board of county commissioners may provide for the paying off of said bonds at any time after ten years from the date of the issue of said bonds; and provided further, that none of the bonds authorized by this act shall be


