Trunis Shea, 1 year old died yesterday in convulsions at the home of his mother, Mrs. Mary Shea, on the third theer of the apartment house 231 East Ninety-sixth street, after having swallowed a spoonful of medicine. The police declares the baby's death was caused by the mistake of a drug clerk, and are search-

Sa day the baby was taken il with a stomach complaint. His condition improved and when the falmily physican, Dr. T. A. Gonzales, called yesterday he said the baby could be taken out for an airing after a small quantity of medicine was given to it. He wrote a prescription for half an ounce of "laxel," a harmless cathartic. Mrs. Shea sent her daughter Hannah, aged 8, to the drug store conducea by H. L. Berger, at Second avenue and Ninety-sixth street after the med ed to have been on duty at the time. and in filling the prescription gave half an ounce of "lyel" instead of 'laxol," He put three labels on the bottle, one of which was "poison" mark, and another that the contents were for external use only.

When the bottle arrived, Mrs. Shea looked at the labels, but paid no heed to them, supposing they had pro bably been put on by mistake, "The doctor ordered this," she said to her daughter, "and whatever Dr. Gon

zales orders is all right. After tasting the drug, which burned the tip of her tongue, she abminstered a spoonful to the baby. He was taken with convulsions, and Mrs. Shea sent her daughter to warn the drug clerk. Cantor looked up the prescription and discovered his error. He than sent an antidotel and instruction as how the child should be treat-While Mrs. Shea wts working over the child, Cantor telephoned to the offices of a number of physicians in the neighborhood, and succeeded in summoning Dr. Issac Stern, of 106 East Ninety-sixth street.

Dr. Stern rushed to the house and tried to save the baby's life, but it died. He reported the circumstan ces the the coroner an and investigation was ordered. The police were called in, and when they went to the drug store were told that Cantor had left. The proprietor, Berger, said Cantor had telephoned to him at his home and requested that he he go to the store at once. When Cantor told his employer of the accident he instructed the clerk give himself up.

Dr. Gonzales says that when avenue, in the afternoon, he was met by Cantor who asked him for a substitute prescription. The physician says that Canter wanted one calling for "lyo"." It was refused. Coroner Hallenstein has instructed Dr. T. Lebane to perform an autopsy today to learn the cause of the baby's death. No specific charge has been made against Canter, but if caught he will be held until the coroner ends his investigation.
