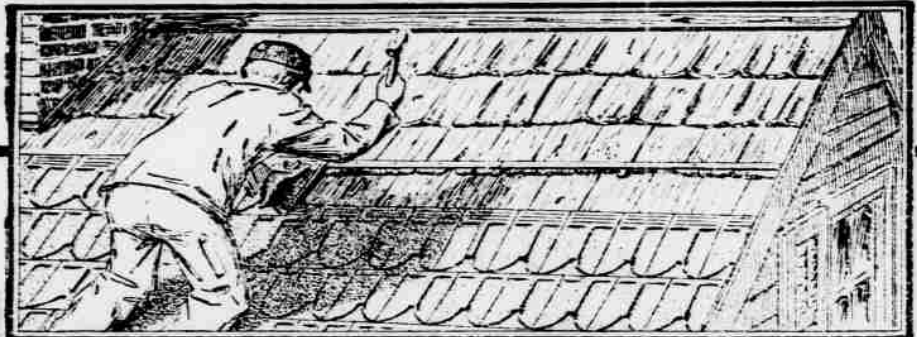

**Stand of Laxol.**

Timothy Shea, 1 year old died yesterday in convulsions at the home of his mother, Mrs. Mary Shea, on the third floor of the apartment house 231 East Ninety-sixth street, after having swallowed a spoonful of medicine. The police declares the baby's death was caused by the mistake of a drug clerk, and are searching for him.

Sunday the baby was taken ill with a stomach complaint. His condition improved and when the family physician, Dr. T. A. Gonzales, called yesterday he said the baby could be taken out for an airing after a small quantity of medicine was given to it. He wrote a prescription for half an ounce of "Laxol," a harmless cathartic.

Mrs. Shea sent her daughter Hannah, aged 8, to the drug store conducted by H. L. Berger, at Second avenue and Ninety-sixth street after the medicine. Dr. B. Carter, a clerk is alleged to have been on duty at the time, and in filling the prescription gave half an ounce of "Laxol" instead of "Laxol." He put three labels on the bottle, one of which was "poison" mark, and another that the contents were for external use only.

When the bottle arrived, Mrs. Shea looked at the labels, but paid no heed to them, supposing they had probably been put on by mistake. "The doctor ordered this," she said to her daughter, "and whatever Dr. Gonzales orders is all right."

After tasting the drug, which burned the tip of her tongue, she administered a spoonful to the baby. He was taken with convulsions, and Mrs. Shea sent her daughter to warn the drug clerk. Carter looked up the prescription and discovered his error. He then sent an antidote and instruction as how the child should be treated.

While Mrs. Shea was working over the child, Carter telephoned to the offices of a number of physicians in the neighborhood, and succeeded in summoning Dr. Isaac Stern, of 106 East Ninety-sixth street.

Dr. Stern rushed to the house and tried to save the baby's life, but it died. He reported the circumstances to the coroner and an investigation was ordered. The police were called in, and when they went to the drug store were told that Carter had left.

The proprietor, Berger, said Carter had telephoned to him at his home and requested that he go to the store at once. When Carter told his employer of the accident he instructed the clerk to give himself up.

Dr. Gonzales says that when he returned to his office, 1456 Lexington avenue, in the afternoon, he was met by Carter who asked him for a substitute prescription. The physician says that Carter wanted one calling for "Laxol." It was refused. Carter went away and is supposed to have come to his home at Rockaway. A policeman was sent there to arrest him last night.

Coroner Hallenstein has instructed Dr. T. Lebane to perform an autopsy today to learn the cause of the baby's death. No specific charge has been made against Carter, but if caught he will be held until the coroner ends his investigation.

Bryan Downed in Nebraska. While the California Republicans were putting their machine in condition for the scrap heap, the Democrats of Nebraska were doing things to Mr. Bryan. In the primaries he was utterly routed. Every candidate friendly to Bryan or to his ideas was defeated, while those candidates against whom Mr. Bryan spoke most harshly were elected with great majorities. Dahlman, one-third friend of Bryan, but now an enemy and an out-and-out anti-county optionist defeated Shallenberger for the nomination for governor. Shallenberger was originally an anti-county option man, but for the sake of the Bryan support he agreed to sign a county option bill. As a result Shallenberger was turned down, while Dahlman took the nomination.

In the senatorial contest Congressman Gilbert M. Hitchcock, who broke with Bryan stood the brunt of the Bryan fight. R. L. Metcalfe, Bryan's editor and close friend, was put up by Bryan against Hitchcock and received the Bryan vote. Hitchcock was nominated by a 3-to-1 vote.

Of six Democratic candidates nominated for Congress five are out-and-out anti-Bryan men. This, taken together with Hitchcock's victory, is regarded as putting the finishing touch to the repudiation of Bryan by the Democracy of his own state. Mr. Metcalfe, who was so badly defeated, is supposed to be closer to Mr. Bryan than any other man in the country. He has been his confidential political adviser for many years.—Greensboro Patriot.
