FOUR MILLION DOLLARS ANNUAL TAX BILL

Three-Year Program For Tax Revision Required, According To An-

alysis. (Washington Special)

The nation will face a continuation of the annual tax bill of four billion dollars for a period of at least three years if Congress adopts recommendations drafted by treasury officials and which, it was understood have been laid before Secretry Houston for approval.

Mr. Houston, it was said, probably will include such recommendations in the form of an analysis of the government's financial condition in his forthcoming annual report to Congress. The analysis will show, and accompanying recommendations will suggest, it was said, that a three-year program for tax revision is in order to meet maturing government obligations and cover current federal expenses.


