THE TERCENTENARY FOR THE FIRST POTATO

Was Introduced In America 300 Years Ago Next December.

Chicago, Ill., Feb. 6.—The tercentenary of the planting of the first potato in the United States will be next December, according to Dr. Berthold Lauffer, curator of anthropology, of the Field Museum here.

"The potato entered this country," Dr. Lauffer said, in an address before the American Association for the Advancement of Science, "not as surmised by de Candolle, through an alleged band of Spanish adventurers, but in a perfectly respectable manner from Bermuda, where it had been introduced some years previously from England."

"It is a prank of fortune that the potato, originally a denizen of Chile and Peru, appears as a naturalized Englishman in the United States. The potato had arrived in England about 1586 or a little later."

"For a long time the belief was entertained by botanists that the openauk, described among the wild roots of Virginia by Thomas Hariot in 1588, was to represent our potato. This speculation is erroneous. Data from the History of the Bermudas now make it perfectly clear that the potato was one of the plants which at that time and until then (that is, 1621) Virginia had not."

"The History of the Bermudas reports that in 1613 the good ship Elizabeth brought potatoes from England to Bermuda. The history further states that on the 2nd of December, 1621, Captain Nathaniel Butler, Governor of the Bermudas, sent from St. Georges, in the Somers Islands to the Governor of Virginia (Francis Wyatt,) two large cedar chests wherein were fitted all such kinds and sorts of the country plants and fruits, as Virginia at that time and until then had not, including potatoes."

PICK EMPLOYEES WITH CARE

Modern Business Men No Longer Rely on the "Hit-or-Miss" Method of Selection.

There was a time when picking employees was a hit-and-miss job, a trial-and-error matter which few employers believed could be corrected. This is the day of doing things right and the modern employer is now selecting his associates, from the office boy to the man highest up, with as much care as he would launch on an entirely new business venture. William Marvin Jackson, director of the Personnel Development service, writes:

"If employees are carefully selected, with an eye to their real adaptability and fitness for the work to be done, it goes without question that they are much more likely to take an interest in their work, and hence, the business itself. If they are interested, they will get along well with their fellows and co-operate with their superiors. All of which means that they will grow, and there is no satisfaction for the employee greater than that which accompanies the knowledge that he is getting somewhere. Patting him on the back may make him feel good, and paying him a good salary may make him work harder. But giving him a new job and bigger job will alone make him supremely happy, will alone make him work with complete abandon, with thorough-going enthusiasm."

French and British commissions are giving most serious attention to water power as a substitute for coal. Britain's coal, though still plentiful, is within measurable distance of exhaustion. France never had coal enough. Both, therefore, are making every effort to develop a form of power which can not be exhausted. Extensive works are projected to utilize the waterfalls of the Jura mountains and the French side of the Pyrenees, while a British group of investigators has reported that in one district of Scotland water power can be developed sufficient to take the place of nearly 2,000,000 tons of coal per year.

GOVERNOR MORRISON TO MAKE WAR ON KU KLUX KLAN IN STATE

Has Measure Under Consideration Which Would Prevent Operation Of Organization In North Carolina; Governor Is Opposed To Enforcement Of Law By Secret Societies; Says This Is Function Of Government Which Needs No Underwriting.

Governor Cameron Morrison is not only opposed to the organization of the Ku Klux Klan in North Carolina but has under consideration a measure which will prohibit the operation of the Klan in this State.

The Governor is standing flat footed against organization which attempts to enforce law enforcement in the State. This, the Governor believes, is the function of the State and the Federal government and there is no authority under the spirit of law at least for the underwriting of its processes by a secret order. This, the Governor understands, is the purpose of the Ku Klux Klan.

Governor Morrison is ready to

concede high services rendered by the Ku Klux Klan in the dark days of Reconstruction. There was justification then, according to his views, because such a step was necessary to maintain Anglo Saxon civilization in the South.

At this time, the law is abundantly able to cope with any situation which develops and if not, the General Assembly of North Carolina is biennially in session, subject to call into special session at any time, and it may provide new law if that is needed.

Just what steps the Governor anticipates taking is problematical. It is known that he has conferred with a number of interested men in the State concerning this order and feels very deeply concerning it.

The present organization, known as the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, is said to have a large following in Georgia, South Carolina and other Southern States as well as a big membership in New York. Its membership is said to be made up of lawabiding and sober citizens. Organizing in Raleigh recently as the first point, local branches were established in many points in North Carolina.
