NEW CAR RUMOR FALSE SAYS FORD Will Make No Changes in Models This Year.

"We do not contemplate making any changes in our present car models," stated W. A. Ryan, Central Sales Manager of the Ford Motor Company, Detroit, in denial of the many rumors circulating throughout the country to the effect that Ford intended to change the design of the present car.

The statement was addressed to the Ford branches in the United States, and reads as follows: "Several branches have reported persistent rumors in their territory to the effect that a change in body design is contemplated during the year, even going as far as to say some of our assembly plants are already receiving shipments of new body material.

"We have never considered it good business judgment to make any guarantee covering a definite period on matters of this nature, but you may advise your dealers that those alleged rumors are false, as we do not contemplate any changes in our present car models."

It was also pointed out that many minor changes had been made in the car during the past year, such as installing a slightly different gasoline tank, and changing the size of the steering wheel from twelve to fourteen inch, and that these changes will continue to go through from time to time as they are recommended by Ford's engineers.
