NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION IN STOVALL SCHOOL DISTRICT

A special election will be held in Stovall School District on Tuesday, September 6, 1921, for the purpose of voting upon the question of issuing not exceeding Forty Thousand Dollars of serial bonds of Stovall School District and levying a sufficient annual tax to pay the interest and principal of the same. The said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, and the principal shall be payable in annual installments or series, beginning not later than three years after the date of said bonds and ending not more than thirty years after such date. Said Election shall be held and conducted and the qualifications of voters at said Election shall be determined as nearly as may be practicable in accordance with the general law relating to Elections (for Members of the General Assembly.

For said Election there shall be a new registration of the qualified voters of Stovall School District.

At said Election the voters, who are in favor of the issuance of said bonds and the levying of said annual tax, shall vote a ballot which be written or printed the words "For Bond Issue," and the voters, who are opposed to the issuance of said bonds and the levying of said tax, shall vote a ballot on which shall be written or printed the words "Against Bond Issue."

At the close of the polls the Election Officers shall count the votes and make returns thereof in duplicate, one copy of which shall be delivered to the Board of County Commissioners, and the other filed with the Clerk of the Superior Court of Granville County.

For the purpose of holding said Special Election A. G. Lewis is appointed Registrar and H. A. McGhee and J. E. Lumpkin are hereby appointed Judges of Election.

The Bureau of Biological Survey has received a report from a correspondent who states that on his plantation on the Cooper River in South Carolina he has found twenty-nine American egrets where formerly there were none. Two years ago there were two birds and last year he counted ten. These rare birds are protected by the Federal migratory bird act.

HALF EXTRACTED TEETH OUGHT TO BE PRESERVED

(Milwaukee Sentinel) More than 50 per cent of the teeth now being extracted could be saved by proper treatment, Dr. J. F. Biddle of the University of Pittsburg told the National Dental Association here.

"Teeth are in many cases the source of bodily ailments and their extraction has in some instances resulted in cures which seem almost miraculous," Dr. Biddle said.

"However we must not lose sight of the fact that many times teeth are sacrificed with the hope of curing almost every disease known to 'Undoubtedly abscessed or pulpless teeth should not be permitted to remain in the mouth if they cannot be put in a healthy condition. On the other hand all teeth in which pulps have been removed should not be condemned."

Proper treatment which Dr. Biddle said would save half the teeth being pulled consisted of "infinite" care on the part of the operator, strict observance of approved methods of sterilization, the verifying of results by the X-Ray, and follow-up by examination and X-Ray at regular intervals.

A burial service at sea by wireless is the subject of much comment in Liverpool. A fireman aboard a freighter had died and as no burial service was available a full service was sent by wireless, the dictation lasting an hour. In the end the body was committed to the sea.
