

Extension Service Prepares Bulletins On Tomato, Tobacco

Publication of two new bulletins was announced this week by the State College Extension Service. They are Extension Circulars No. 331, "Control Tomato Late Blight,"

and No. 332, "Curing Bright Leaf Tobacco."

Copies of both may be obtained by writing the agricultural editor, State College Station, Raleigh. The request should specify the name and number of the publication desired.

The 12-page circular on tobacco curing was prepared by R. R. Bennett and S. N. Hawks, extension tobacco specialists, who emphasize the need for curing economy and for improvement in leaf quality as influenced by the curing process.

"Each year," says the authors, "it is difficult to find any tobacco on the warehouse floor that does not show some abnormal condition which reflects improper curing." While pointing out that it is impossible to give a formula by which all tobacco can be cured, they do offer a number of suggestions which they believe will prove helpful in supplementing the previous experience of the individual grower.

D. E. Ellis, associate professor of plant pathology for the Experiment Station, and H. R. Garrison, plant pathologist for the Extension Service, prepared the bulletin on late tomato blight, a fungus disease which reduces the North Carolina tomato crop by thousands of bushels each year. They report that excellent control of the disease has been obtained with "fixed" copper sprays and dusts, such as tribasic copper sulfate, cuprous oxide, and Copper oxychloride.
