Sealed proposals will be received by the Oxford City Board of Education at Oxford, N. C., in the office of the Superintendent up to 2:00 p. m., May 29, 1951, and immediately thereafter publicly opened and read, for the furnishing of labor, material, and equipment entering into the construction of the Addition to Oxford Graded School, Oxford, N. C. Complete plans, specifications and contract documents will be open for inspection in the office of the Architect and in the office of the Superintendent, or may be obtained by those qualified and who will make a bid, upon deposit of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) in cash or certified check for General, ten dollars (\$10.00) in cash or certified check for plumbing, heating, or electrical plans and specifications. The full deposit will be returned only to those submitting a bona fide proposal and provided plans and specifications are returned to the Architect in good condition within five days after the date set for receiving bids.

The work will require all labor, materials and equipment necessary for the construction of a one-story building containing eight class rooms, a library, boiler room, offices, toilets, storage spaces, cafeteria, kitchen, etc. Walls shall be of brick and concrete masonry units; floors generally of asphalt tile over concrete; roof decks of precast concrete slabs supported on steel and concrete joists; finished roofs shall be built-up, over rigid insulation. Necessary plumbing, heating and electrical equipment and fixtures will be included; separate proposals will be received for General, Plumbing, Heating and Electrical work.

All contractors are hereby notified that they must have proper licenses under the State laws governing their respective trades. General Contractors are notified that "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting" ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 19, 1923, and as subsequently amended ("Public Laws of 1949 ratified May 23rd") will be observed in receiving and awarding general contracts. Plumbing and Heating Contractors are notified that Public Laws of 1931, Chapter 52 as amended by Public Laws of 1933, Chapter 37, will be observed in receiving and awarding plumbing and heating contracts.

Electrical Contractors are notified that provisions of Chapter 37, Public Laws of 1937, will be observed in receiving and awarding contracts for all electrical work installed in the project. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a cash deposit or a certified check drawn on some bank or trust company, insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, of an amount equal to not less than 5% of the proposal or in lieu thereof a bidder may offer a certified check of 2% of the bid plus a bid bond of 3% of the bid, said deposit to be retained by the Owner as liquidated damages in event of failure of the successful bidder to execute the contract within ten days after the award, or to give satisfactory surety as required by law. ("Public Laws 1935, Section 1 Chapter 400, General Statutes of North Carolina, 1949, C. 143, Art. 8, S. 129, as amended by Public Laws of 1949.) Checks shall be made payable to C. G. Credle, Superintendent.

Performance Bond will be required for one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price. Payments will be made on the basis of eighty-five percent (85%) of monthly estimates and final payment made upon completion and acceptance of the work. No bid may be withdrawn after the scheduled closing time for the receipt of bids for a period of thirty days.
