Dairy Month Is To Be Marked in June, A. I. Park Chairman

Albert I. Park, of Pine State Creamery Company has been appointed local chairman of June Dairy Month observance in Oxford and this area, state June Dairy Month chairman C. H. Willard, of High Point, has announced.

For the fifteenth consecutive year the entire industry, spearheaded by national and local leaders, will cooperate in the promotion of June Dairy Month activity. The story of milk "from grass to glass" will be told to varied groups of citizens throughout the country. This year the theme is "For A Stronger Nation, Essential Dairy Foods".

The purpose of this special emphasis upon dairy products during June is to promote the growth and understanding of the dairy industry; to keep citizens informed about the nutritional value of all dairy foods; to increase dairy products sales during this peak production period, thus providing dairy farmers a stable market for their milk at the time of year when surplus production tends to become a problem.

N. C. State College, the State Department of Agriculture, State Board of Health, Department of Public Instruction, Restaurant Association, Milk Producers Federation, Dairy Products Association, Jaycees, and other civic and public organizations will participate in the observance of June as Dairy Month.

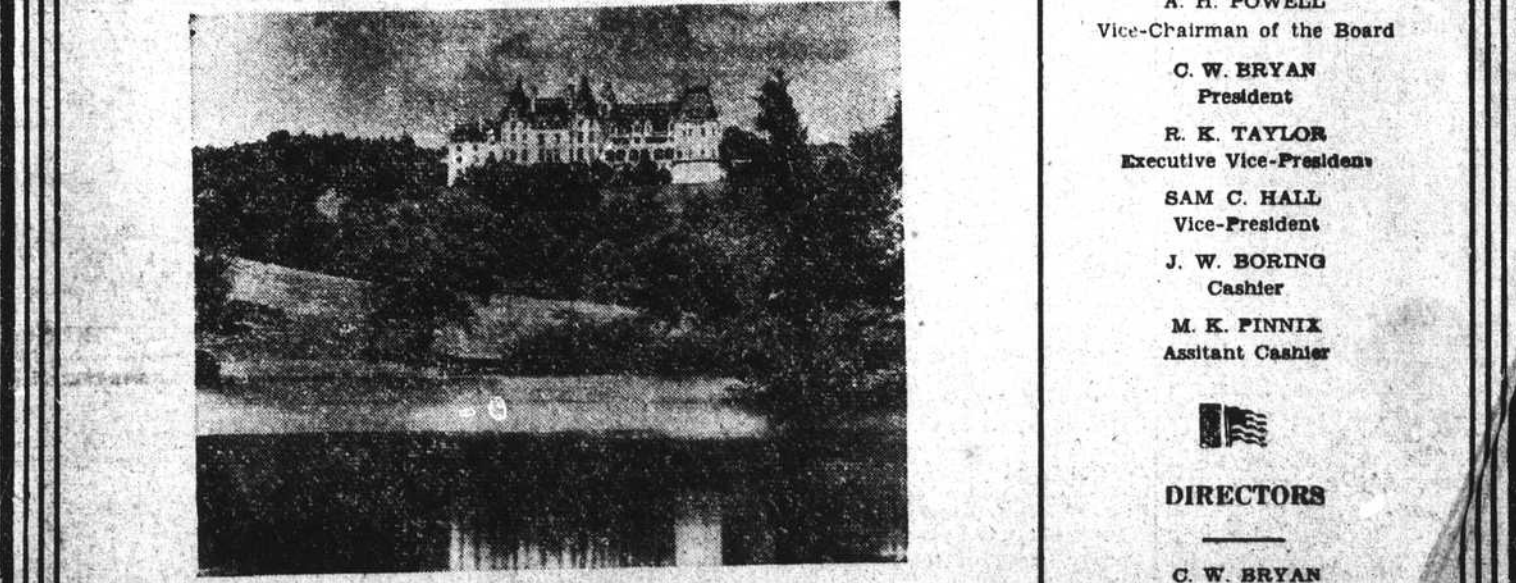

This beautiful estate, near Asheville, covers over 12,000 acres of farm and forest lands. Vanderbilt's home contains priceless art treasures, and 110 bedroom suites, a spectacular spiral stairway, and among other things, a chess table, said to have been used by Napoleon I during his exile on St. Helena.
