Dr. Carroll Lauds N. C. Leadership On Segregation Issue

Superintendent Addresses Meeting of School Unit Leaders

Addressing the winter session of North Carolina School Superintendents held the past week at High Point, Dr. Charles F. Carroll, state superintendent of public instruction, said North Carolina is probably farther advanced in its approach to the segregation problem than any of the other states concerned.

"By abstaining from anticipatory and precipitate administrative action," Dr. Carroll said, "our leaders have not confused nor have they inflamed the minds and emotions of the people."

He also said no "responsible" person in the state has made a statement or committed an act that he had to retract or regret later.

"Instead, our governors, legislators, attorneys general, advisory commission members, educators, school boards, newspapermen and others have consciously striven to create and sustain an atmosphere in which people can think clearly and act intelligently."

"This procedure is characteristic of the manner in which North Carolinians have always approached grave problems and decisions. It is this approach that causes many people elsewhere to look to us for guidance."

Dr. Carroll also said it was in "this calm setting" that the state's brief was prepared for the Supreme Court, which must still set up the machinery to carry out its desegregation order of last May 17.

Atty. Gen. Harry McMullan and his staff of assistants prepared North Carolina's brief and Dr. Carroll said "it is viewed as a model" for other states. He said the Institute of Government's legal analysis of the problem and the Governor's Advisory Committee's work had been helpful in the state in its approach.

"All of these events are integral parts of North Carolina's plan to preserve the public school system, respect community attitudes, and solve properly the manifold social, legal and economic aspects of the perplexing problem," he said.

He added that "under the calm and stable leadership of Gov. Hodges and the general assemblies of the year's ahead, I am confident that this state will resolve the issue of segregation to the satisfaction of all who genuinely want it resolved."
