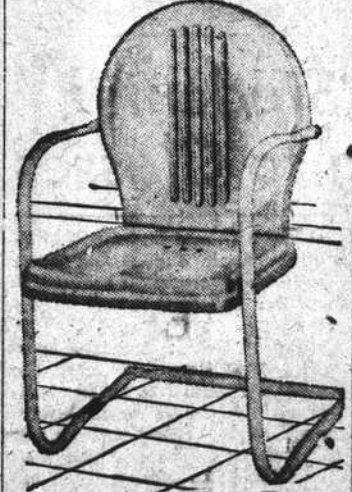
Efird Closing More Stores in Its Chain
