

Plans Developing For JCL Session

Oxford Students to Have Part in State Meeting at UNC March 21

North Carolina Junior Classical League will hold its nineteenth annual convention in Memorial Hall of the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill Saturday, March 21. The Department of Classics, of which Professor Albert S. Kin is chairman, is host to the convention.

State officers are led by President Steve Hobbs of Charlotte and Mrs. Joe Rhinehart of Webster, state sponsor. Other officers are Vice-President Bruce Vaudeblooin of Lenoir, Secretary Cynthia Wharton of Greensboro, Treasurer Patricia Starnes of Durham, and Historian Linda Neskang of Swannanoa.

Professor B. L. Ullman, professor-emeritus of the University, will again be the featured speaker of the morning. He will be presented by Professor R. B. House, former chancellor of UNC, who will also bring greetings from the University to the 1750 delegates expected to be present. Attendance is limited to one-third of North Carolina JCLers, as Memorial Hall can accommodate no more.

The Latin Club from Webb High School of Oxford will be responsible for several features. One is a dramatic skit on last year's JCL National Convention, written by Joy Forsythe, to be presented by a dozen Oxonians. Ailie Ellington will lead the devotional by singing "The Lord's Prayer", with Jack Breedlove accompanying him at the piano. This is his third year as convention pianist. Meyer Dworsky will lead the group in the pledge to the flag in Latin, after which Oxford's sponsor will lead the 1,750 in singing "America", also in Latin.

After the general session from 9:45-11:00, selected delegates will participate in seven workshops, as follows: Program led by Henderson; Roman Banquet by West Mecklenburg of Charlotte; Costumes by Sacred Heart Academy of Belmont; Publicity by Lenoir High School; Historians by Charles D. Owen High School of Swannanoa; Latin Week by Enka High School; and Treasurers by Durham High School. Senior Classical League

The failure to attend school netted two Oxford youths sentences to training schools in cases heard by Juvenile Court Judge A. W. Graham this past Friday afternoon. Jimmy Rich, age 14, Oxford Elementary student, was found guilty of violation of a probation sen-

tence requiring regular school attendance. Rich was sentenced to Jackson Training School, Concord, until discharged by the authorities. Marshall Breedlove, age 15, Oxford Elementary student, was charged with truancy, theft, and violation of a probational sentence requiring regular school attendance. Breedlove was found guilty and sentenced to East Carolina Training School at Rocky Mount until discharge by the authorities.
