BLAINE OUT. Secretary Blaine will not be a candidate for the Republican Presidential nomination. I have the highest authority, next to Mr. Blaine himself, for making this statement. The decision of Mr. Blaine is the result of his belief that his health, though now good, will not bear the strain of a canvass for the Presidency, and the consequent duties of the Presidential office.

MR. BLAINE AND HIS FRIENDS. His early retirement from the field, which is probable, will not only be his unwillingness to undertake the labor either of the Presidential office of a campaign leading to it, but also the fact that he has recently been chafing under the restraint of not being able to say that Mr. Blaine was a candidate, and who feared that he would stay in his undefined position until the eye of the national convention and then throw his followers to the winds.

AN UNEQUALLED REFUSAL TO BE A PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE. WASHINGTON, Feb. 6, 1892. My Dear Sir: I am not a candidate for the Presidency, and my name will not go before the Republican National Convention for the nomination. I make this announcement in due season.

THE PRESIDENT KNEW IT WAS COMING. Attorney General Miller, when a member of the Cabinet, is closer to the President, listened to Mr. Blaine's views with interest. It is said that he was not surprised at the withdrawal of Mr. Blaine from the race.

SENATOR CULLOM'S CHANCES. The disposition of Lincoln for lack of the backing of his own State in the question of Senator Cullom's strength to be considered. The Senator has some strong friends in the State, and it is not impossible that he would be able to give him a few votes, but the Illinois delegates would be his principal force, and he is not considered a serious rival of the President.

OHIO WILL BE FOR HARRISON. 'Will his friends accept this as a trial? I think they will. I can say that Ohio will now send a Harrison delegation to Minneapolis. There has always been a strong Blaine sentiment in Ohio, and this has never been so strong as it has been since the late election. That has been because John Sherman has heretofore been a candidate.

NEW YORK'S DELEGATES. The anxiety of the situation centers on New York's vote. The President has done nothing to create a popular following for himself in this State. He has many advocates among the leading business men of the State, but he has not secured the support of the people.
