REV. A. S. MORRISON.

This able divine filled his appointments in Reidsville last Sunday. The Primitive Baptists granted the Disciples the use of their church and showed them every courtesy possible, which was greatly appreciated. Mr. Morrison was greeted by large congregations at 11 A. M. and 3:30 P. M. The following is a synopsis of his morning sermon:

Text: John xv:14
Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you.

These words of Jesus suggest to my mind the Theme, What is Religion? Analyzing the word, religion, we find it to signify a rebinding, hence, as applied to our relation to God it is therefore the rebinding of the soul to the Father of our spirits. If this is its meaning, then there was a time when the soul was bound to God by the sweet ties of love and obedience, but this bond was severed and thereby man was separated from God.

There is but one thing that can separate man from God and that is sin. And what is sin? "Sin is the transgression of the law." We find, therefore, that by the disobedience of one man many (that is all) were made sinners. Rom v:19

Religion was unknown and unnecessary prior to the transgression of Adam. When God gave to him and his posterity that which we term religion. That is a system of moral and spiritual government whereby it was possible to return to God in the bonds of peace and love.

What does the christian religion consist of? Not in any one thing, but in that which establishes friendship between us and Christ. Of this faith is the substance, the foundation. "For without faith it is impossible to please God." For you and I must believe not only in God but in his son Jesus the Christ. But, faith cometh by hearing the word of God. This, then, is one step toward the healing of the wound of separation. This is not simply an intellectual assent but a commitment of your soul to God.

Following this, I find that Christ commanded repentance. "Except ye repent ye shall all likewise perish." No man can ever be saved without obedience to this command. It is not simply sorrow, nor indeed is sorrow itself, repentance at all. "But godly sorrow worketh repentance unto salvation." Repentance is a complete surrender of your will to God's will. So long as you assert your will, you never can be saved.

Obedience to Jesus also includes baptism; and by this is meant the immersion of the believing penitent, in water. This is not a work, in any sense, but an act of faith, that is pleasing to God. It is "The obedience of faith." Here then we have three steps, bringing us into covenant relation with God. These are the medium through which we appropriate the salvation purchased by the blood of Jesus Christ. It is all of grace and the unmerited love of God commended toward us.

Finally, crowning this obedience, God gives to such as love him, and keep his commandments the Holy Spirit to dwell in the heart a heavenly guest. "Because ye are sons God hath sent forth his spirit into your heart crying father, father."
