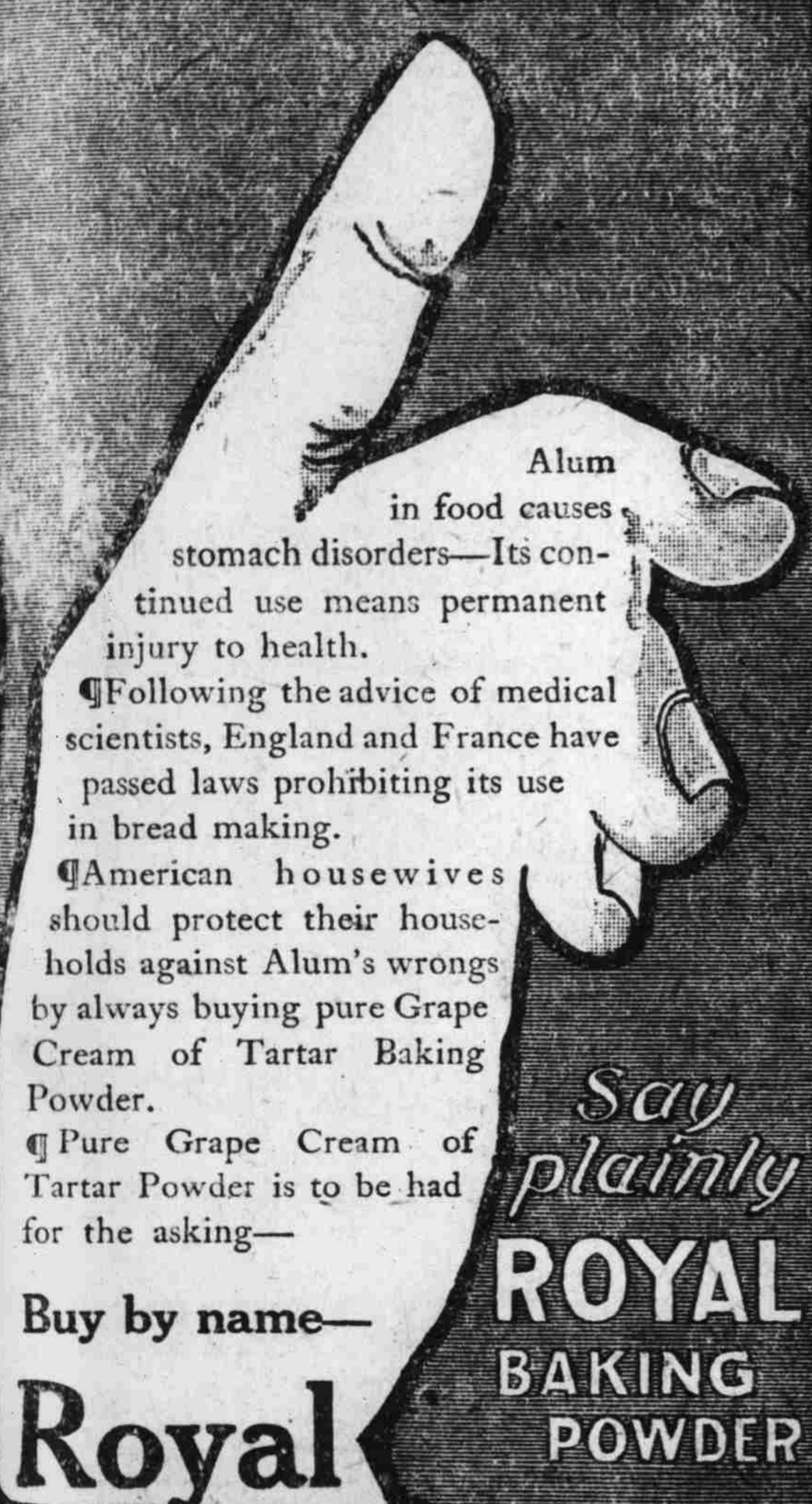

Following facts: The American Tobacco Company and the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, both of New Jersey, had been doing business in this State for many years. There was passed a law that made it necessary for these and all other foreign companies to domesticate under the laws of this State. This was not done in the case of the two tobacco companies named and then the Messrs. Guthrie and others of this city had chartered the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, of North Carolina, in this firm being two brothers of the late Col. W. T. Blackwell, who was one of the originators of the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company. The first thing after getting the charter was to have issued an injunction against the other companies to prevent the using of the name of the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, in this State. This is the matter that has now been decided and which the State's highest court says must be tried in the courts of North Carolina.—Durham Herald.

**THE CASE OF THE BLACKWELL DURHAM TOBACCO CO. DECIDED.**

The Supreme Court rendered an opinion late yesterday afternoon that sustains the decision rendered by Judge Fred Moore in the case of the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, of this city, against the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, of New Jersey and others. This opinion of the State's highest court means that the case must be tried in the State courts. This is the case of the newly organized Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company chartered under the laws of this

State, against the American Tobacco Company and the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, of New Jersey, and others, these being the local managers of the two companies named in this city and this State.

When this litigation first came up there was a motion to remove to the Federal Court, this being on the ground that the defendant corporations are foreign and that the local managers were simply joined in order to defraud the jurisdiction of the Federal Court. Judge Fred Moore heard this matter last August and then decided that it was a case for the courts of this State. The defendants promptly appealed to the Supreme Court of the State. Now the Supreme Court has affirmed the decision of Judge Moore and so far as the courts of this State are concerned it is a settled fact that the case must be tried on its merits in the State courts.

This is an injunction proceedings of the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company of this State against the American Tobacco Company and the Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company. The State company, which was chartered under the laws of this State after the foreign corporations had failed to domesticate. The restraining order asks that the foreign corporations be restrained from manufacturing tobacco under the name of the company in this State.

The first great fight, which has been on up to this time, has not touched the merits of the case at all. The only contest has been which court shall try the case—the State court or the Federal court. This has now been decided and the case will come up on its merits at a term of court to be held later this year. In brief this case is based on the fol-
