Erom the New York World we clip the following recital governing the payment of principle and interest by the Cuban government.

The recitals in the bond make the principal due ten years after he evacuation of the Island of Guba by the Spanish forces and all revenues are pledged to the payment of principal and interest. It is to be understood hat while the time is specified or the redemption of the conons, payment may be deferred antil six months after evacuaion by Spain. They are to be receivable as taxes in proporion of one-fith. There is no upset price. but no bid under 60 er cent of the face value will be received. This reservation adicates that if the securities re floated at all, there will be t least a fair return for the promise of the belligerents.

There will be fusion on the State ticket; the Populists will hold to their demand for Governor and the Republicsns will concede this despite all the pres

## ent denials."

He declared most positively that the Republicans would never concede this and that the result was case of an irresistable force act ing on an immovable body.'
