GENERAL REMARKS.

Revenue Stamps may be used indiscriminately upon any of the matters or things enumerated in schedule B, except proprietary and playing card stam se for which a special use has been provided. Postage stamps cannot be used in payment of the duty chargeable on instruments.

It is the duty of the maker of an instrument to affir and cancel the mamp thereon. If he neglects to is no, the party for whose use it is made may stamp it before it is used; but is no case can it be legay med wishout a samp; and if used after the 30 pane, 1864, and used without a stamp, it allowed be efficiently stamped. Any time upon the part of the maker of an instrument appropriately stamp it, reoders him liable to a

The assignment of a mortgage is subject to the sage stamp duty as that imposed upon the original instrument; that is to say, for every som of five handred dollars, or any fractional part thereof, of the ament secured by the morgage, at the time of its assignment, there must be afflied a stamp or stamps, denoting a duty of fitty cears.

When two or more persons join in the execution of an instrument, the stamps to which the instrament is liable under the law, may be affilied and cancelled by one of the parties.

In conveyances of Real Estate, the law provides that the stamp a xed must answer to the value of the estate on interest conveyed.

No stamp is required on any warrant of attorney accompanying a bond or note, when such bond or no'e has affixed thereto the stamp or stamps denoting the date required, and whenever any bond or nets is secured by mortgage, but one stamp duty is required on such papers, such stamp duty being the highest rate requires for such instruments, or either value or dellommation or the stump and ed he value of dedomination of the stump atheed eigment of the instrument which is not stamped.
