GENERAL ORDER No. 2.

TO preserve the peace of society and to prevent drunkenness and disorderly conduct in the town of Salisbury, it is ordered:

1 That all licenses heretofore granted to sell intoxicating or spirituous liquors, are revoked, and any sale of intoxicating liquors by any person, will subject the stock to confiscation and the offender to punishment.

2 Soldiers or citizens found drunk will be arrested by the Police guard and subjected to such punishment as the military authorities in the case of soldiers; and the civil authorities in the case of citizens; shall determine.

3 Under the term "spirituous liquors," are included all patent drinks, such as "Plantation Bitters" &c, and the giving away of any article that can intoxicate will be considered a sale within the meaning of this order.

The Provost Marshal and the commanding officer of the Police Guard will be vigilant in ferreting out and bringing to justice any offenders against the provisions of the above order.
