THE DOG EATER IN RALEIGH.

A Queer Animal is Slaughtering the
Canines in Brooklyn.

The dog killer has arrived and
he is using an entirely different

No one has as yet caught a
glimpse of the queer animal but
the evidence of his presence is un-
mistakable. Saturday night three
dogs in Brooklyn were slaugh-
tered. About 2:30 Sunday morn-
ing Mr. Alston Freeman heard his
dog bark as if terribly frightened,
then all was quit. He went out
in the yard to ascertain the cause

some beast had literally chewed
his dog's head up. Mr. Freeman
tried to see the beast that had

ished.

fate on the same night in Brook-
lyn. The beast devoured the head
and forequarters of one of these
dogs.

this strange animal as yet. Some,
however, say that the dog slayer

Brooklyn. Three boys say that

thicket a remnant of one of the dear
departed canines.
