Slept Twenty-Eight Days.

The infant child of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Shoaf, died at their home in the city yesterday after being very strangely afflicted for six weeks. When the child was five days old it fell asleep and continued to sleep for 28 days. In spite of the efforts of parents and physicians to wake it up during this period it continued to sleep. A little milk which was administered by prizing its mouth open was the only sustenance it had. The case has completely baffled the doctors who saw the child.

The child waked up about two weeks ago and shortly afterwards took cholera infantum from which it died yesterday.

The doctors agree pretty well that the cause of the child's long sleep was some brain affection. A post mortem was held yesterday and the brain taken out. The brain has been put in alcohol and when sufficiently hardened will be thoroughly examined.

The Remains of Columbus.

The Count de las Infantas, one of the descendants of Christopher Columbus, has held a conference with Senor Sagasta, begging him that the remains of his illustrious ancestor be transported immediately from Havana to Spain and reinterred at the Royal Chapel at Madrid, with the full honors of an admiral of the Royal Spanish navy, the highest rank held by him in his lifetime.

The Count de las Infantas is anxious that the government should undertake at once the removal, and that the remains be brought to Spain in the marble sarcophagus, in which they are supposed to rest in the cathedral of Havana. He does not think that any objection would be offered by the United States government to this plan, but if so, he begs that this privilege be made one of the peace terms, to be firmly impressed upon the peace commissioners.

Columbus died in 1506 at Seville, and was buried there, although in his will he asked that he be buried on the Island of San Domingo. Thirty years later his son was able to carry out his father's wish and the discoverer of America was laid to rest in the cathedral of San Domingo.

When Spain lost that island in 1795 and the governor-general was ordered to evacuate, the remains of Columbus were taken up and transferred to Havana, where they now lie in the chapel of the cathedral. On a marble slab at the entrance to the chapel appears this inscription in Spanish: "Oh! body and image of the great Columbus, be ye preserved for a thousand centuries in the urn and in the memory of our nation."

Said to be 101 Years Old.

Allen Whittington, who lives up on Stony Fork creek, near the Wilkes and Watuga line, is said to be 101 years old. He has a young wife, aged about 30. Mr. Whittington does his own work and often makes trips to Wilkesboro, a distance of twenty miles. He likes to tell of the good old times of long years ago. Mr. Whittington's brother, Alex, who lives on an adjoining farm, is 96 years old.
