A Sweeping Injunction.

An injunction issued a few days ago by United States District Judge McCormick, of Texas, against the railway commission tariffs and orders made since August, 1894, and leaves railroads free to promulgate their own rates, unless the commission shall undertake to adopt new regulations acceptable to the roads during the pendency of the present suits. Judge McCormick does not in his decision question the constitutionality of the commission law, but sets aside the commission tariffs and rulings on the broad ground that they seem to be unjust to the roads; that the rates allowed are too low to permit the roads to make a fair profit on the investment represented. It seems the commission, on account of the low price of cotton and wheat, made a rate schedule which threw the burden on the railroads.

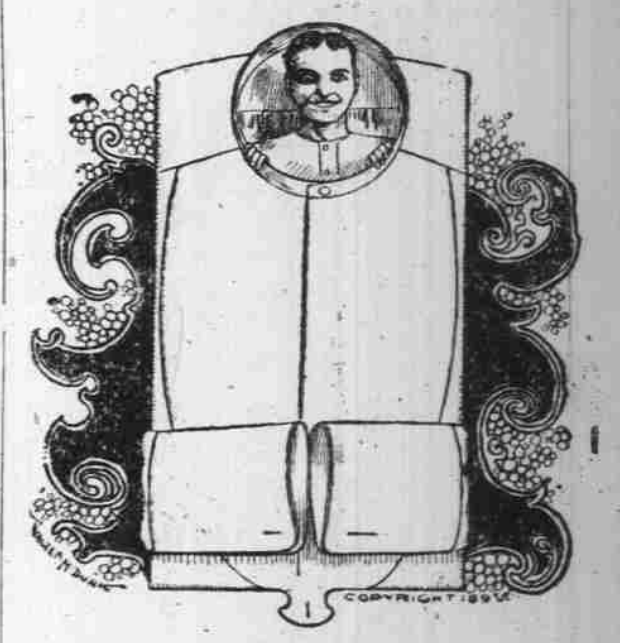
