The Old State Looking Up.

The Old North State is slowly but surely improving. We have stated that our farmers this year raised more cotton than ever before; and in addition the largest food crops have been gathered; our manufacturers have all worked up to their full capacity, many cotton mills specially working night, as well as day forces. Labor generally has been employed at living rates at least. This condition of the industrial forces is well reflected in the improved condition of the banks of the State. According to the statement this week issued by the State Treasury Department, the loans and discounts by our State, private and savings banks amount to \$7,000,000 in round figures. The capital of these banks with which these loans are made, including surplus funds, undivided profits and deposits of all sorts, amounts to something over \$10,000,000, which shows the conservative, yet generally useful management of these institutions. This statement does not include, we believe, the National banks.

As we say, everything now indicates a healthy condition of the Old State, and the prospects of advancement along all lines are most gratifying. Let us all take courage, and WORK. All of us may not, certainly will not get rich the next year, but we can, by honest energy and constant, intelligent application, secure at least a comfortable living, for ourselves and families.

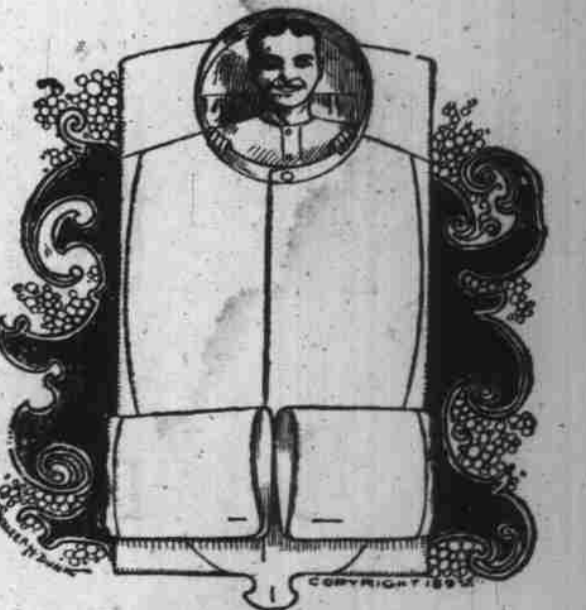
